

GLIMPSES OF HERITAGE TOUR

An insightful journey across Pakistan to discover its best-kept secrets is an unforgettable experience. The tour, right from the beginning in Islamabad, the federal capital, till the end in Karachi, the financial hub of Pakistan, will give you an understanding of how the magnificent ancient civilizations—Indus and Gandhara—flourished along the Indus River, what made the invaders invade it, why Sufis made it their home, and how the emperors established their huge empires, right from the Mughals of Persia to the British in Europe. Throughout the tour, you will be mesmerized by the magnificent archaeological sites. Taxila is known for its collection of Buddhist religious monuments, including the Dharmarajika stupa, the Jaulian monastery, and the Mohra Muradu monastery. In short, every city, town, and village that we will visit throughout the tour has a thrilling story of its own. With the rich and stunning cultures in Lahore to feast our eyes on (with Badshahi Mosque, Badshahi Fort, Lahore Museum, Shalimar Gardens, Shahi Hammam, etc.), Harappa, an important archaeological site of the Indus civilization, stands witness to the 5000-year-old cultural continuity of civilization in Pakistan. The imposing Derawar Fort, the deserts of Cholistan, and Makli Hills, the world's largest necropolis with over a million graves, tombs, and mausoleums, will make your trip worthwhile.

Mohenjo-Daro, an impressive and well-preserved archaeological sites of the Indus Valley Civilization, which was the world's most developed ancient culture, the findings suggest a well-developed agriculture system where trade was conducted with real financial sophistication with other civilizations, beautiful art tells of their way of life, baked brick buildings provide an impressive vista of urban architecture, and drains and wells speak of their height of engineering. Overall, the findings suggest an impressive society that had developed a complete living system of its own. The high intensity of spirituality at Sufi shrines in Sehwan-Sharif, Uch-Sharif and other elaborately decorated shrines like those of Sheikh Bahad-ud-din Zakriya, Shah Shams Tabriz, and Shah Rukn-e-Alam in Multan are worth visiting. Our Pakistani heritage is an absolutely spectacular journey through its history and breathtaking landscape.

Full day tour of Taxila Archaeological sites & the old Raja Bazar in Rawalpindi.

DAY-5 PESHAWAR - KEHWRA SALT MINES - LAHORE

Peshawar-Katas Temple: 295 kms & 3.5 hours' drive

Katas Temple-Khewra Salt Mines: 22 kms & 45 minutes' drive

Khewra Salt Mines-Lahore: 260 Kms & 3.5 hours' drive

Leave the hotel at 07:00 am in the morning towards Lahore. On the way; visit Katas Raj Temple & Khewra Salt Mines.

DAY-6 LAHORE

Full day city tour of Lahore.

DAY - 7 LAHORE

After an early breakfast drive to Cholistan Desert and Derawar Fort. In the afternoon drive to Bahawalpur. Visit Noor Mahal

DAY-11 BAHAWALPUR - UCH SHARIF - SUKKUR

Bahawalpur- Uch Sharif: 78 kms/1.5 hours' drive Uch Sharif- Sukkur: 310 kms/3.5 hours' drive

Drive to the archaeological sites of Uch Sharif. After visiting Uch Sharif drive to Sukkur.

DAY-12 SUKKUR-MOHENJO DARO-SEHWAN SHARIF

Sukkur- Kot Diji-Mohenjo Daro: 135 kms/3 hours' drive Mohenjo Daro – Sehwan Sharif: 150 kms /2.5 hours' drive

Drive to Mohenjo Daro visiting Kot Diji en-route. Visit the archaeological site of Mohenjo Daro. After lunch drive to Sehwan Sharif. Upon arrival and check-in at hotel visit the Shrine of Lal Shahbaz Qalandar. Attend Sufi dances in the evening.

- Kot Diji Fort
- Mohenjo Daro
- Shrine of Lal Shahbaz Qalandar
- Dhamal (Sufi Dances) in the evening



DAY-13 SEHWAN SHARIF-RANIKOT FORT-BHIT SHAH-HYDERABAD

Sehwan – Ranikot Fort: 88 kms/1.5 hours' drive Ranikot Fort- Bhit Shah: 140 kms/2.5 hours' drive Bhit Shah – Hyderabad: 60 kms/1.5 hours' drive

After breakfast visit Ranikot Fort, then the Shrine of Shah Abdul Latif Bhitai. Finally drive to Hyderabad for the overnight stay.



FAQ

• Is Pakistan safe to travel to?

In the main Pakistan is a safe country to travel around, there are some random incidents but this is like anywhere in the world these days. On a day to day basis it is safe to get around especially key cities like Islamabad & Lahore. Like any country one must be vigilant, our team is always aware of the situation so if precautionary measures need to take place these are implemented.

• What do I need to wear?

You can wear western clothes as a woman or man. However it must be remembered that Pakistan is a muslim country so clothes should generally be loose, 3/4 arm length sleeves, skirts or dresses should be below the knees. Hair does not have to be covered except when entering places of worship. Shoes should also be taken off when entering a mosque. For the North it is best to dress with layers, for Islamabad & Peshawar their seasons follow the UK and temperatures do get cold Oct - March so warm attire is recommended.

How much money do I need to take?

Eating out & shopping in the main in Pakistan is cheap, particularly at the moment when the currency is so weak. £3 will get you a 3 course meal at a very nice restaurant.

• What's the weather like?

The weather in Sindh, from Multan down to Karachi tends to be hot all year around. The best time to visit this region is Nov - Feb. The Northern areas of Pakistan get very cold with temperatures dropping below freezing. The best to visit this part is April - October. Islamabad, Lahore & Peshawar tend to have similar seasons to the UK, with the need of a coat or cardigan in the winters.

What's the local currency?

The local currency is Pakistan Rupees, our guide will arrange to take you to a local Bureau De Exchange where you can exchange your currency and get the best rates. We will also help you get a local SIM which you can use throughout your trip to ensure you remain connected without paying exuberant international charges.



NEXT STEPS

- A follow up telephone call to take you through the itinerary
- A deposit of £500 if further work is required to fine tune the itinerary, this will be deducted of the final invoice. We continue to work on the itinerary until you are happy with it. This is for private tours, in the case of group tours amendments can be made based on group consensus.
- Deposit of 50% to be paid once happy with the itinerary or we can arrange an instalment plan of 4 payments, if time permits. Final payment would be due 8 weeks before your departure date.
- 3 weeks before your travel date we could create a whatsapp group made up of you, me and the team in Pakistan so that you can greet each other before your arrival in Pakistan. I would be contactable throughout your time in Pakistan, should a need arise for you to contact me, such as any changes in plan to due to ill health or change in interest once in the country. However rest assure that the team are very well versed to help you with all of these aspects.
- I will share video links of vloggers who have covered some of these areas to help you get excited about what awaits you, if you wish, some people prefer to discover themselves.
- In the case of group tours, a zoom or teams call would be arranged so you can meet others on the tour and with your consent a group whatsapp group would be created.
