Open-fire cooking inside homes dangerously **impacts people's health**

- About 3 billion people throughout the world cook with open fires in their homes resulting in nearly **4 million deaths every year** from diseases caused by inhaling the smoke.
- More people die each year from the complications due to open-fire cooking than from HIV/AIDS, malaria, and tuberculosis COMBINED.

Traditional open-fire cooking also negatively **impacts the environment**

- Open-fire cooking consumes vast quantities of wood leading to **deforestation and desertification** in many of the world's poorest countries.
- Each open fire emits the same amount of CO2 as an automobile each year.
- It also produces **25% of the world's black carbon emissions**, a leading cause of climate change.

The life-changing impact of a clean cookstove

The Cookstove Project trains and supervises families to build and maintain their own clean cookstove, using the simplest of locally available materials—clay, water, and straw.

- Homes are no longer filled with smoke and soot.
- Families breathe much cleaner air.
- The increased efficiency of the stoves means a lot less time spent gathering fuel and cooking.
- The stoves use up to 75% less fuel, significantly reducing the impact on the environment.
- Because it consumes far less wood, a clean cookstove emits one ton less of CO2 each year than open fire cooking.

What is the Cookstove Project?

The Cookstove Project's goal is to prevent the deaths and diseases that are caused by cooking indoors over an open fire. Using locally sourced materials, we help families build safe, efficient, clean cookstoves. Our solutions are unique to each country where we work.

We focus on personal and community ownership, which ensures that the new cookstoves will continue to be used for years to come while preserving traditional ways of life. We also educate each family in the construction and use of their custom-made cookstove to guarantee sustainability.
