Happy November, beloved!

A few weeks ago, I (finally) had an idea for how to keep our tradition of blessing pets alive during this season of pandemic. After many weeks of no brainstorming, I was admittedly starting to feel some despair when, out of the blue, an idea landed in my lap that seemed simple and “doable” in an online environment. We would invite our online worshipping community to share photos of their pets, put together a slide show (“Pet Parade”), and offer prayer and blessing over the various critters that God has entrusted to our care as they “paraded” across the screen. I could not have been more pleased with how it turned out, and the response to it has been really inspiring as well. Thank you!

In honor of that most blessed event, and of St. Francis, I offer a Psalm:

PSALM 148

*Praise the Lord from the earth,
you great sea creatures and all ocean depths,
8 lightning and hail, snow and clouds,
stormy winds that do his bidding,
9 you mountains and all hills,
fruit trees and all cedars,
10 wild animals and all cattle,
small creatures and flying birds,
11 kings of the earth and all nations,
you princes and all rulers on earth,
12 young men and women,
old men and children.*



It’s delightful to be reminded that praises come forth from sea creatures deep in the ocean, lightning and hail, snow and clouds, and stormy winds ... from mountains, hills, and trees ... things that fly, and creep around ... and wild animals and cattle, and THEN we get to humans. Humans come *AFTER* cattle.

Yep. We come after the cattle. Author and public theologian Nadia Bolz-Weber has suggested it is because we are “complicated.” Whatever the reason, it is really humbling.

*Nadia continues, “I think maybe animals, in their not-nearly-as-complicatedness, have something to teach us about praise. Because I’m pretty sure that praising God is not the same as sycophantically stroking God’s ego because God has low self-esteem and created a cosmic entourage just to remind God how great he is. I’m pretty sure the cattle aren’t doing this. The way in which creeping things of the Earth praise God is to simply creep on the Earth. The creatures simply praise the creator by being creatures. **Their being is in itself praise of the source of their being.**”*

This is such a good word for us right now, dear ones. How helpful it is for us to hear that cattle do not get their identity or sense of worth apart from God?! Sea creatures do not care about the stock market or the number of folks who “like” their Twitter posts in determining their value. Value resides in their being who God created them to be.

Wouldn’t it be something if we were to claim this liberating truth ... that OUR value resides in OUR being who God created us to be? Like all these creatures, we just praise the One who created us simply by being who we were created to be! Our very being as an act of praise toward the source of it all!

Perhaps it is this kind of uncomplicated love and acceptance that we experience so powerfully in our pets of all shapes and sizes and personalities. What a gift to the world it would be if we were to grow to see glimpses of the same love and acceptance in each other!

Treasurer's Report September 2020 For Council Meeting 10/13/2020

September income was \$15,242 expenses were \$22,841. We transferred \$814 of funds so the total net income was negative \$6,785. Current reserves are \$51,088 in the general fund, \$9,9848 in the building fund, and \$13,126 in work of the church.

January through September update: We budgeted \$246,000 and received \$183,036 in unrestricted contributions, leaving a negative \$52,963 for income. \$15,919 was transferred from the building fund to cover mortgage and snow removal and we have had \$236,837 in regular expenses and budgeted for \$267,028.

September 8, 2020

Treasurer / Financial Report – Cory - (August income \$32,042 / expenses \$23,258. Contributions bounced back from July, and because physical Worship expenses are on hold, our position is steady. Reserves would cover about 3 months expenses . PPP loans are expected to be forgiven. We are holding for information regarding paperwork filing requirements. Council President has drafted a letter of thanks to be published for our contributing congregation.) - Jenny / Geri **APPROVED**

Our Response to the Word (old business)

Stewardship for All Seasons & Strategic Planning – update – Dorie – Planning is well underway for an October 11 announcement. Print materials and digital versions are in final edit prior to printing. Mailing scheduled for October 12. Stewardship Focus is being lifted up for 1) the need for technology upgrades to reach our congregation under 'distancing;' 2) taking advantage of building access for improvements such as interior painting [special appreciation for the immense contributions of work and expertise from Josh Stumpner] and concrete repair; and 3) sustaining ministry excellence. Especially during these times these areas will help support the mission of GSLC. Efforts necessary are expected to increase by around a tenth. Commitment will be invited by November tenth. A MOTION was proffered by Geri, seconded by Paul authorizing plans as described to move forward.

(new business)

Sunday School – current status and contingency planning: - The prior Sunday School team became unavailable upon short notice. Sunday School programs are generally on hold during the pandemic risk. Council and staff have concerns for 'online fatigue' among area school aged children due to school system requirements and workloads so are hesitant to employ this venue, and currently seeking acceptable alternatives. Notification is being drafted for parents of school aged children to keep them informed. Jenny Samperisi generously offered her interim leadership.

Confirmation / Status of confirmands and students - Pastor Kemp is investigating safe means for performing the rite of Confirmation for this year's eligible confirmands, with a tentative plan for late October, with details to be communicated with those families. Mary Jane Horvat is generously coordinating with confirmands to remain connected via participation in 'drive-up' Eucharist and other opportunities to foster meaningful spiritual experiences and learning opportunities until control of the pandemic allows safe direct instruction.

GSLC congregant survey results - Response level was encouraging with eighty-four people providing their views. Special effort was made to contact those congregants who are unavailable via usual digital routes of communication. The value of input directly from stakeholders in GSLC cannot be overstated. Important insights from the first survey (regarding people's attitudes about 're-opening') include: people are evenly split regarding the question of whether in-person Worship should resume soon – but interestingly, much fewer than half would attend if such services resumed soon. The majority would not return in-person prior to an effective vaccine. But great uncertainty remains for those who might return. Willingness to assist with in-person worship is less than half, presently. People are inclined to continue online Worship in conjunction with in-person. Most people are happy to wear their own mask when corporeal Worship does resume.

Worship service. September 13th outdoor – update - Plans firm. It's on.

[Special observation] – The staff's GSLC Teacher Appreciation yard signs, honoring the dedication of our teachers who have been placed in a very difficult situation, have been greatly appreciated.
