

A colleague of mine recently shared what I thought was a powerful and meaningful experience he had in his very small congregation in a rural Minnesota town of about 100. Relatively recently, the congregation decided to meet on Wednesday instead of Sunday ... the only Sunday worship they have is during Lent! The schedule is very similar to what we do at Good Shepherd. There is a meal at 5:30pm with worship at 6:30pm. The decision to make this change was primarily driven by their desire to invest in the lives of the children in their community.

A typical Wednesday starts around 4:30pm with the children showing up and just hanging out. On a particular Wednesday at about 6:20pm, the children approached Pastor Jeff and told him a new family had just moved in down the street. "Can we see if they want to come for dinner and church tonight?" Pastor Jeff agreed (of course) and off they went, returning shortly with the children of the household. The attendance that evening was 38, fifteen of whom were children … and much to the delight of the mostly 75+ years old adults!

To quote another colleague, "Holy WOW!"

But it gets even better!! The meals on Wednesday nights are usually potluck, and there was one 8-year-old boy who showed up faithfully every week by himself for the meal and worship. He felt bad that he could not bring any food to share with the assembled group. So, he wrote a letter to the church council asking if he could have permission to plant a small garden on the property that he could tend and then give the food to the church? I can't wait to hear what happens, and I sure do hope that church council is listening and paying attention to the voices and actions of this emerging group of young leaders ... and I hope someone helps Austin build his raised vegetable garden and grow things, and that his produce will be shared generously for years to come! That one seemingly small thing might even change the whole community!

Do we listen well? Are we paying attention? Nothing is impossible when God is involved, and we become God's hands and feet in our community and beyond!


I've asked the following question often over the last 20+ years of pastoral ministry: "What would you be willing to do to make sure that your grandchildren have a living, breathing faith that works in real life?"

Hopefully we're willing to do most anything in order to cultivate and pass on a faith that not only changes lives but changes the world around us.

Imagine what might happen if we suspended judgment and tuned in even a little bit more to the ways emerging generations are already expressing their faith?

While on the Boundary Waters faith trip this past July, I came to discover a few things. I did my best to just appreciate the small things around me on the trip and expand my appreciation of God's beautiful creations. I also gained an understanding of where prayer can occur. I now realize that prayer does not have to always have to occur in a particular environment, and instead can occur in multiple different places in different ways that may feel less traditional.

Through the various experiences in the Boundary Waters, I now feel as though my faith has been strongly impacted and as a result I hope to continue to strengthen my faith.

The beauty that God had made was very easy to see within the boundary waters. After the boundary waters trip, it is very easy to see God within normal items. Normal items like water, trees, the stars, the painted sky, the golden sun, the flowers growing from the ground, and the little birds that sit in the tree. I can hear God within the silence and yet can still hear him within the loudness and craziness of the world. After going to the boundary waters I will do my best to preserve his beauty, I will help to reduce my carbon footprint in as many ways as I can. This will help to ensure his beauty will be preserved for future generations. Because I believe that everyone should go to the boundary waters at least once in their life. It is such an amazing place to experience. Time does not exist in the boundary waters, neither do the stressfulness of the world, or the distractions of phones.

As an adult leader for this faith-focused trip, I felt a great deal of responsibility for helping to support the faith-growth opportunity for everyone. As was Tim when he suggested before we left that we, as the adults, would most certainly learn something on the trip from the youth! I know I did. And for that I am forever grateful!

I thank you, Good Shepherd family, for granting me the opportunity to accompany our youth on an absolutely incredible, faith-growing, strength-affirming, outdoor experience like none I've ever had!

I live to inspire and serve and learn, and I was able to do all of that and more in the beautiful Boundary Waters Canoe Area of northern Minnesota.

### Treasurer's Report – August 2019 Summary

August income was right on budget at \$26,500, which is amazing for august. August expenses were \$30,000 which was \$1000 over budget, this is mainly due to it being a three pay period month, and some equipment maintenance. For the year, our income is now only \$7,000 below budget, a marked improvement from a couple of months ago, when we were down over \$30,000. What a wonderful demonstration of generosity and commitment to our church and mission. An amazing response to the summer fund drive! Total income is \$206, 000. Expenses are \$15,000 under budget for the year. Things are looking much better! Praise the Lord!
