

The first weekend in November, sixteen Confirmation students plus four guides headed to Imago Dei Village for the annual Blast retreat. We worshipped, sang, played, studied Bible verses, went on a scavenger hunt, ate and slept under the direction of super camp staff. Thanks to Good Shepherd for providing this opportunity to grow in our faith!





I met Roberta a few weeks ago. It wasn't a particularly warm day, as I recall, but it wasn't quite as cold as it has been these last few weeks either. I was standing nearby when she was asked if she was warm enough, what she said will stay with me, "I'm never warm enough." Has that ever been your reality ... that you're never warm enough? I'm not talking about the desire to be a few degrees warmer than you might currently be. I'm talking about never being comfortably warm when it's cold. I'm sure some of you know all too well what that's like. Personally, I've never felt it, and it disturbs my spirit greatly to know folks in our own community live like that.

Roberta is part of a community in Wausau with whom most of us never have any interaction, or if we do, it's memorable in a less positive way. They hang out in the library sometimes, or on the 400 Block. They sometimes seek shelter in our parking garages, or you may find someone huddling in a public restroom to stay warm and dry now and then. They've been in the local news a LOT lately because especially this time of year they tend to be the cause of sore eyes in our sight.

They're homeless ... and there are a lot of them around.

A few weeks ago, the Good Shepherd staff took dinner down to the picnic shelter near Big Bull Falls where some homeless folks often congregate. It was nothing overly planned or fancy. Our staff gets together quarterly for a planning day and often we do something together just for the experience. So, we heated up some chicken noodle soup in a huge pot and brought along some hotdogs. That's how I met Roberta. She brought the grill. I assume she had found it in front of someone's house or in a dumpster. It had seen its better day, but it was her offering. She had retrieved it from its hiding spot in the brush near her camp sight. Obviously, you can't walk around with your charcoal grill over your shoulder everywhere you go, and unlike most of us, she didn't have a patio or deck to leave it.

There was just so much to take in during that couple of hours that we all spent together under that shelter, huddled by a makeshift fire made of leaves and sticks in a grill that barely stood on its four bent and rusty legs. All of us so different and bringing with us such diverse backgrounds and stories, yet united for a moment or two as we were by our hunger. Yes, hunger for food ... but also for the community that we could somehow form together. I left that evening both humbled and hopeful.

I just cannot imagine that anyone would want to live amongst the brush, or in parking decks, or in public restrooms, or in the streets, or under the bridges of our city, and certainly not in any permanent way. I cannot fathom that anyone would consciously decide to be part of community within a community that largely lives completely unnoticed by anyone else, until they land in a location where they are not wanted. And I am even more appalled that voices in our community actually say out loud that these folks have chosen to live like this as if it's an option just like choosing to live in the wealthier parts of town.

But here's the thing ... I did not hear a single person complain on that evening. Not like I complain. Not like the people I run into every day both at church and beyond complain. Nope. It seems people with everything at their fingertips have forgotten how to be content. But our new friends were actually quite content ... content with the clothes on their back, content with one pair of boots, content to share any good fortune that they had come across with someone else who needed it, content to never be warm enough, content to just be where they were at that moment in community with three strangers who dared to step onto their turf for a while and bring something to eat. I'm not saying any of us were necessarily comfortable. But contentment can find its way into any circumstance if you let it.

And as we all stood around that pitiful little charcoal grill filled with wet leaves and twigs with weenies on a stick ... it felt like communion. We didn't have any bread and wine, but together we could not have been a more earthly bunch of elements brought together to somehow become a community ... and we were ALL blessed to go from that place and discover what that means.

May the light of the manger warm our spirits to do the same this Christmas season!



10 Tips for the Season Holiday Nutrition Strategies

he fall months roll into "the holidays." For many people, extra pounds roll on along with the favorite holiday foods and treats. Here are 10 tips to enjoy healthy nutrition and maintain your weight through the holiday season.

1 Eat breakfast.

Studies show people who eat breakfast take in fewer calories during the day.

2 | Plate it.

Putting food on a plate, rather than grazing at a holiday party, helps you be more mindful of what you're eating and how much.

3 | Portion control.

Grab a smaller plate to help manage the temptation to put more on your plate than you need.

4 | Start with veggies.

Eat a few healthy vegetables first to curb your appetite before sampling holiday treats.

5 | Choose proteins.

Nuts, low-fat dairy, legumes, and lean meat in healthy portions will help you feel full.

- 6 | Skip it. If you don't love it, don't eat it!
- 7 | Slow down.

It takes your brain time to receive the signal that you're full, so slow down and enjoy every bite.



- 8 Wait for the seconds. If you wait 10 minutes, you'll feel more full and the temptation for seconds will pass.
- 9 | Focus on a few bites. The first bites are the most satisfying; enjoy them without thinking you need the entire dish.
- 10 | Be a little brave. Experiment with new flavors and seasonings; you might find some new healthy traditions.


