April is upon us! Wow!

I want to continue this month sharing with you a little bit about some of the ways I currently serve beyond Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, particularly at the local and synod level.

First, a little back story. A few months ago, Angie and Bonnie attended an event on the east side of the state called “Workers in Paradise.” Good Shepherd has supported their participation in this synod-sponsored workshop for church workers for several years now. This year, one of their speakers was Sue Rothmeyer from the Office of the Secretary of the ELCA, who shared with the group that congregations are encouraged to update their congregational constitutions every three years. This happens to coincide with the Churchwide Assembly where updates are submitted and approved for the model constitutions of the Church. I was not aware there was any expectation or encouragement to update constitutions, so I was curious to explore this process and have more conversation about next steps with Good Shepherd’s constitution.

Fast forward ... I have been serving on the Synod Council for almost a year now (I’ll talk about that in a future article), and a recent topic was the approval of updated constitutions that congregations have submitted to the synod. Little known fact (for me), when you update your congregation’s constitution, it must be approved by the synod council. Our synod did not have a process for doing this expediently, and there are 25 congregations awaiting said synod approval, so you can probably see the benefit of developing a process, and we are doing so post haste.

For those who know me well, feel free to go ahead and laugh right out loud now because, yes, yours truly is a new member of the inaugural East Central Synod of Wisconsin Constitutional Review Committee! Having always been one who’s eyes gloss over at the mention of the word “constitution” and any mention of language therein, it should come as absolutely no surprise that my normal choice would be to watch grass grow in my yard rather than work on a constitution. However, I am also wise enough to know that since Good Shepherd needs to update our constitution, and I will need to lead us through that process, it will be prudent to “bone up” on how we walk through that process together, and I’m motivated about that prospect. So, beginning in a few weeks, I will have my nose buried in congregational constitutions awaiting approval from throughout our synod for the foreseeable future. And I also expect that I will be well-trained and ready to move forward when we enter that process here at Good Shepherd sometime in the Fall.

While your church council will be the primary stewards of this process, if this is something that fits your gifts and/or skill set, please let us know and we would be most willing to utilize your previous experience and appreciation of processes that require patience and great attention to detail.

## From your Parish Nurses MARCH

April is a time of new growth as winter fades away and the landscape turns green. Easter comes and brings triumphant joy. Our joy can be contagious. Laughter is one of the great things God has done for us. Laughter is one way to help you and those around you feel good. Laughter has been researched and studies have shown we can benefit from laughter. Laughter improves the function of blood vessels increasing blood flow which helps protect against cardiovascular problems. Laughter boosts the immune system. Laughter increases immune cells and infection fighting antibodies and decreases stress hormones. A good belly laugh can temporarily relieve pain as the body's natural painkiller endorphins are released. A belly laugh gives every system in the body a good workout. The release of endorphins also promote a sense of well-being. The stress hormones epinephrine and cortisol decrease during and after laughing so we feel less stressed. The immune system benefits because of increased production of antibodies, activation of the bodies protective T-cells and the killing of tumor cells. Ultrasound has shown increased blood flow during laughter. Endothelium, the protective lining of blood vessels expands increasing blood flow in the body and decreasing vessel inflammation. A study showed repetitious laughter can lower systolic blood pressure, and can have an effect on cholesterol resulting in healthier cholesterol levels. Laughter needs to be used in conjunction with healthy living practices such as eating healthy foods and exercise. Laughter alone cannot achieve good health but is a valuable contributor.

How can we add more laughter to our lives?

- Spend time with people who find humor in everyday life.
- Keep a journal of funny situations or stories you heard.
- Share stories that make you laugh with others.
- Laugh at yourself.
- Observe the humor in children.
- Read a book that has humor in it.
- Watch a humorous movie.
