Shepherding Growth in Faith Fall Appeal results:

As you know, we did a fall Stewardship drive at Good Shepherd for the first time in several years. We had mailings, bulletin inserts, temple talks, and a phone campaign, all led by many dedicated volunteers. The results are in and encouraging.

We had 109 letters of intent returned, a great response rate especially for the first appeal in many years. The number of responses allowed us to earn a \$5,000 challenge grant.

65% of those who returned intent cards increased their giving. THANK YOU! This shows the energy and excitement that is building here at Good Shepherd. While we may still have challenging decisions in 2020, we know that we will come together as a community of faith with the confidence and passion to charge forward in ministry.

Happy New Year!

In last month's item (also found in the 2020 Annual Report), I encouraged us to take a closer look at what it means to "make spiritual meaning" in our lives. While stressing the importance of remaining "centered in Christ," I challenged Good Shepherd toward a five-year discovery process together around three core challenges:

Building and cultivating awareness of God in our everyday lives.

Reconnecting to God's story ... and who we are as God's people.

Creating environments that help people make spiritual meaning out of their lives.

I suspect it's obvious to everyone that Good Shepherd has grown leaps and bounds in the last decade in terms of building strong community ... and we can be thankful for this great blessing! So thankful, in fact, that I believe the only possible response is to lean into all of that good work and find the deeper connection between it and our depth of spirituality as a people called together to serve the Lord almost 55 years ago. After all, what is a congregation united around the mission to *Gather*, *Grow* and *Go* if we are not gathering, growing, and going from a deeply discerned spiritual core? And we learn more fully how we are called from our center in Christ as we rediscover the powerful connections between God's story and our story.

So, what's your story? How does building and cultivating awareness of God in our everyday lives awaken that story and become a tool for developing deeper and more meaningful relationships with each other?

I want to encourage all of us once again this month to wrap our thoughts around ONE THING: What is something that you have experienced in your life as a follower of Jesus Christ that, given the opportunity, you would want to share with someone who is not yet a follower of Jesus Christ?

That's it.

Just one thing.

You don't have to do anything but think of a faith story you would share with someone else.

I'm not suggesting that it's easy at all. But what I hope it will do is open us up in new ways to how God has been at work in our lives! Perhaps it will even startle you a bit! That's exactly the desired outcome.

Each of us has a story ... perhaps many, many stories that we could share. Let's give some attention this month to just one. Think about what your story is, and how you would share it with someone else.

I'll check in along the way!



nonperishable food.



From your Parish Nurses FEBRUARY

This is a time of the year when most of us are less active and find it difficult to maintain a healthy weight. One way to achieve healthy successful weight loss is to make small behavioral changes. The "200 plan" is a simple plan in which you make small changes in diet and exercise to decrease daily calories. You eat 100 less calories a day and add 20 to 30 minutes of exercise to your regular routine. 100 calories is equivalent to a slice of bread or a small cookie. It is a simple change in diet that is easy to do. The second 100 calories comes from exercise and can be as easy as walking. You can even break it up into 10 minute segments to fit into your daily schedule. The 200 plan can help you lose up to 20 pounds in a year. This plan is evidence based so your effort should yield results. Even a small weight lost can make you feel better. A 1 pound loss of weight from your mid-section removes 7 pounds of weight stress from your knees. A small loss of weight can have significant health benefits.

Treasurer / Financial Report (October contributions and November contributions are both significantly below expectations. Despite holding expenses ~\$20k below budget ytd, our shortfall is >\$35k. Reserves are dwindling.) – Mike / Cory PASSED

Our Response to the Word (old business / open items)

Budget Update - 108 households provided pledges of giving for 2020. The budget will be revisited in Jan. prior to our Annual Meeting.Cory / Mike PASSED

Kartika's Permanent Residency process – continuing in process

Council Positions 2020 – Two members are in discussion as candidates. Two to be asked this week. One considering candidacy in one year.

Stewardship for All Seasons Update – 108 households have proffered pledges. Net increase stands at \$12,000, well below \$49,000 goal. 'Thank You' letters in process. Second year outreach will begin in January. We must effectively communicate the value and urgency. Church Management Software/E-giving Update – Our current systems do not mesh well with our accounting system, and are not 'user friendly' for either contributors or staff. Our current system sometimes necessitates forensic bookkeeping at a cost exceeding the dollar amounts of error. The cost of automated counting systems compares favorably versus the cost or error correction and could replace PowerChurch software which is a current expense.

New Business

Alternative to Financial Secretary / Faith Formation position? – Short term; out information systems consultant will do revenue bookkeeping, but a lower cost solution is sought. Automated income software systems can reduce staff time and expenses.
