Reimagining Worship Update

Your task force on Reimagining Worship continues to meet monthly to discuss and make recommendations regarding worship during the pandemic and provide safe outreach services such as drive up communion and WeCare Bags. We are working on a plan to resume onsite worship which we hope to implement when it is safe to do so. We recently received guidance from Bishop Anne Edison-Albright regarding worship and gathering safely.. Based on information from sources such as Wisconsin Council of Churches, Bishop Edison-Albright has asked all churches in our synod to commit to providing worship and gatherings in the safest way possible (online) through at least February 14. She had also asked that churches develop plans to provide low touch/low contact Ash Wednesday services. Your staff, council, task force and lay leaders will be following the guidance provided by our Bishop in order to keep us all as safe as possible. We ask that you continue to support us with your participation in worship, your prayers and your gifts.

Welcome to a new year! I imagine many among you join me in desperately hoping '21 will be a much better year than 2020. And by the grace of God, I suspect it will, though I'm not sure we all mean the same thing when we say that.

Back in early December, I had a (safe, socially distanced = online) conversation with a colleague who I deeply treasure. We were venting a little bit to each other about the challenges of being in parish ministry at this particular time in history. While it certainly is not the only time pastors have probably had conversations like this one, I imagine those of us who will one day have weathered the season of COVID-19 will have a breadth of stories and experiences to share with those who will fill pulpits someday.

So, the colleague I was chatting with is a retired guy (which actually sounds pretty inviting these days), and knowing he had many years of wisdom from which to share with me some golden nugget of truth, there was a point when I just stopped grumbling and simply said, "This is just hard."

His reply? "I can't imagine." To which I sort of glibly said, "I never wanted to imagine, much less have to respond to something like COVID."

"Well," he said, "we call these 'Opportunities.' This is just another damn opportunity."

To which I replied, "If I am that over and over again will I begin to believe it?"

Obviously, there is a typo there. But it grabbed my attention immediately because of the biblical implications, and as I began to give it some thought, I left him with, "Interesting typo. I may have my next newsletter article!"

So, follow me here ... all the way back in the Old Testament book of Exodus Moses asks God whom he should say has sent him back to the children of Israel, God says, "I AM WHO I AM ... Thus, you shall say to the children of Israel, 'I AM has sent me to you.'" And then we scratch our heads from that all the way to the Gospel of John where there are seven similar designations of God: "I AM the bread... (6:48)," "I AM the light...(8:12)," "I AM the door...(10:7)," "I AM the Good Shepherd...(10:11)," "I AM the resurrection and the life... (11:2)," "I AM the way...truth...life(14:6)," "I AM the true vine...(15:1)." For the sake of simplicity (and brevity), I'll leave it at that, but essentially God declares that God's name is "I AM."

So, back to my typo ... "If I God that over and over again will I begin to believe it?" I have discovered over and over again since March that the answer is a resounding "YES!"

There is no way we would have survived this year at Good Shepherd without the commitment to leave it all up to God over and over again.

When we were faced with creating and distributing worship services online without EVER having done anything like that before, we forged ahead anyway remembering ... "I AM."

When it became clear that our worship benefitted greatly from having volunteers bear some of the important weight of leading worship, we forged ahead and made invitations to people to do things they had never done before remembering ... "I AM."

When we recognized that we were going to need a task force to manage the mountains of ever-changing COVID-19 data, and then make prayerful and faithful recommendations on how we would proceed with worship and other in-person gatherings (a crucial and thankless task), we forged ahead and sought volunteers remembering ... "I AM."

As our finances ebbed and flowed throughout the year, we forged ahead faithfully during the leaner times by reminding and inviting regular generous partnership remembering ... "I AM."

While these are only a few examples from many, we have learned that the message of hope through the Gospel cannot be silenced because "I AM" is in charge, and we are not. And the gospel has been proclaimed and the sacraments have been faithfully shared, even if it looked and felt a little bit different.

Beloved, as we enter 2021, we are stronger for having experienced such growth through the "opportunities" that landed in front of us this year, even if they weren't always what we would have chosen. But we have always been a resilient bunch at Good Shepherd, and I thank you for your continued, faithful partnership in the gospel and for everything you will do to keep shining your light into the darkness in the year to come.




Church Council meeting minutes

November 10, 2020 Socially distanced via Zoom online

Call to Order –6:30 pm *Present: Pastor Kemp, Tim, Josh, Dorie, Heidi, Jenny, M. J., Steve, Brad, Geri, Paul

- Minutes review – Josh/ Jenny - APPROVED
- Treasurer / Financial Report – Cory - (October income was \$14,848 expenses were \$25,486. We transferred \$787 of funds so the total net income was (\$9,715). Current reserves are \$29,805 in the general fund, \$11,273 in the building fund, and \$13,131 in work of the church It is anticipated that the PPP loan of \$41,500 will be forgiven. Presuming this, reserves should return to a level which will allow us to continue operating safely into at least the middle part of next year. Our mortgage lender has allowed for interest-only payments during the pandemic crisis.) - Geri / Steve APPROVED

Our Response to the Word (old business)

- **Stewardship for All Seasons & Strategic Planning – update** – Dorie – Announcement letter was posted October 11. Print materials have been mailed, lifting up Good Shepherd’s mission. Stewardship Focus is being lifted up for 1) the need for technology upgrades to reach our congregation under ‘distancing;’ 2) taking advantage of building access for improvements such as interior painting and concrete repair; and 3) sustaining ministry excellence. Commitment responses have begun to arrive, which is extremely important during this pandemic uncertainty. Follow-up telephone calls are being planned. A SFAS meeting is slated for November 12. Council expresses our deep thankfulness to our staff for again working tirelessly to carry this forward and we heartily thank those who recorded earnest, open messages to the congregation. Tim offered to compose a reminder postcard to assist our congregants in pledging.

(new business)

- **Budget Consideration for Approval:** - The 2021 budget provides expandingly deeper detail. Anticipated possible costs of technology to allow for continued online worship was adjusted upwards as information became available. This is the only change to the suggested budget from last month. A MOTION was offered my M.J. that Council accept the proposed 2021 budget as it stands. Seconded by Paul. MOTION passes unanimously.
- **‘Reimagining Worship’ Committee Update** - ‘Drive-through’ Communion on Wednesdays and Sundays continues to be very well utilized and appreciated. An earlier time is offered on Wednesdays to adjust for shorter daylight hours. The importance of our conscientious communion policies became apparent as we were able to accommodate the positive test results of one of our servers (who remains in our prayers). The second tranche of “We Care” packages of treats and daily use items are in preparation for December 15th delivery to congregation members who may be isolated by Covid health risks or other circumstances. A tangible worship service for Christmas Eve, outdoors in a drive-in fashion in our parking lot, is being planned; weather and infection status allowing. This is expected to offer the Christmas story, candle-lighting and sung experience of “Silent Night.” Two services are in planning.
- **‘Annual Meeting during a pandemic’ planning** - Following synod suggestions and intense research by Pastor Kemp, carefully implemented to adhere to our Good Shepherd Constitution, the 2021 Annual Meeting will follow a hybrid format building on Zoom virtual technology and telephone attendance to carry out the vital communication and decision making for the coming year.

Action Items:

- ✓ Contact M.J. to receive “We Care” packages for council members to deliver.
- ✓ Plan to attend the Annual Meeting and offer help to those with limited technology experience to participate.
- ✓ Prayerfully consider SFAS commitment for November
- ✓ Tim will author an information postcard regarding SFAS pledges, to be sent to the congregation
