Full disclosure, I wrote the first draft of this article about a month ago. Hopefully, you remember June was LGBTQ+ Pride Month, an annual time set aside to honor the 1969 Stonewall Uprising in Manhattan which is considered to be a tipping point for the Gay Liberation Movement in the United States. The purpose of the commemorative month is to recognize the impact that lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender individuals have had on history locally, nationally, and internationally. I attended the Wausau Pride Fest event again this year on the 400 Block on June 4 and was very inspired and impressed with everything about it. It was well-organized, well-attended, welcoming, affirming, and inclusive of all, and I have publicly praised our Wausau event to quite a few folks since that time with a lot of personal pride, gratitude, and hope for the future attached. Most have shared my enthusiasm and desire for the continuation and shepherding of this event toward greater impact and significance in the future. Some have not, which I suppose I expected, but the negativity still landed in a tender spot. I have many dear friends among the LGBTQ+ community, and every time I experience a negative response toward any sort of support and advocacy of inclusion, my heart always suffers a few more hairline cracks as a result.

As I have heard local comments in-person and read many posts on social media since the event, many professed followers of Christ near and far have frequently mentioned Sodom and Gomorrah as the basis upon which they find sexuality different from their own objectionable. As it turns out, I am finalizing this article during the week when this is the first lesson. There has been a lot of tension and rhetoric around sexuality again recently in our country, and it seems like something the church needs to look at more closely as emotions seem to be driving actions again. So, I hope it will be helpful to refresh our biblical memories on the story of Sodom and Gomorrah. This month I will put on my teaching hat and share some thoughts on this Old Testament story from Genesis because it so frequently pops up in discussions about sexuality. While I encourage you to take a look at the story again yourself, because of limited space let's take a look at how the rest of the Bible interprets what Genesis 18-19 means. This powerful story was apparently rather definitive for many from the very beginning, and is referenced throughout scripture by multiple Biblical authors:

- The Prophet Isaiah, writing about 300 years after the story of Sodom and Gomorrah was written, compares the current leaders of Israel to the leaders of Sodom and Gomorrah. Because they are evil, they need to change their ways and "Seek justice: help the oppressed; defend the orphan; plead for the widow" (Isaiah 1:17). In short, the sin of the current leaders of Israel (and the earlier rulers of Sodom and Gomorrah) was exploiting the poor and vulnerable.
- The Prophet Ezekiel, writing some 100 years after Isaiah, is even more specific. In describing the rulers of Judah and comparing them to their "sister Sodom," Ezekiel says "Sodom and her daughters were proud, had plenty to eat, and enjoyed peace and prosperity; but she didn't help the poor and the needy" (Ezekiel 16:49). That's it. That's the sin of Sodom. Having wealth and failing to help those in need.
- Similarly, the Prophet Amos compares the rulers of Israel to the city of Sodom (Amos 4:11). And what does Amos say the Israelites have done wrong? They have taken bribes and turned away the poor who need help (Amos 5:12).
- Jesus himself references the story of Genesis 18-19. He sends his disciples out as beggars without their wallets, or food, with nothing but the clothes on their backs. Of those cities that turn away his disciples who fail to show hospitality to these strangers in need Jesus says it will be worse for them than for Sodom (Matthew 11:20-24).

Those are our biblical references to the "sin of Sodom and Gomorrah." This is not my opinion or a progressive interpretation. This is simply reading the actual words of the story itself and allowing scripture to interpret scripture (a VERY Lutheran interpretive framework, by the way), which leads us essentially toward two options:

(1) The Biblical writers (including Jesus), speaking into the same culture and in the same millennium as the story of Sodom and Gomorrah, are correct. Which means Genesis 18-19 is a story about selfish wealth, ignoring the poor and needy in our community, exploiting the vulnerable, and failing to show hospitality.

<u>Or</u> ...

(2) The Biblical writers are <u>all</u> incorrect, and Pastor Skinnyjeans over at Literal Word Church who is preaching in a different culture some 3,000 years after all of this was spoken, written, or shared is correct and Genesis 18-19 is about same-gender sexuality.

I'm solidly with Jesus on this one.

The point? I believe we need to speak out into the world more boldly and loudly (and without ceasing) how we are called to treat the poor, the needy, the exploited, the vulnerable and the marginalized in this country instead of passing judgment on people based upon their sexuality using scripture as a warrant for our bigotry. The story of Sodom and Gomorrah does not reveal what you may have heard or been told that it reveals. The sin of Sodom and Gomorrah was failing to show mercy and hospitality.

I pulled together the references for you this month, and I wholeheartedly encourage you to look for yourself.

Then, let's talk about what we do in response!


