Beloved,

This is the time of year when our congregation traditionally thinks a LOT about gifts. That probably sounds odd because we've just lived through Christmas with all of THOSE gifts having been long unwrapped and put away or exchanged or returned. And while that's true, our congregation is tuned just a little bit differently. We have just had our Annual Meeting. We have celebrated the year just ended. We have adopted a spending plan for 2021. We have elected new officers to our church council to help lead us forward. And, hopefully, we are also once again discerning our respective gifts of the Spirit for ministry in and through Good Shepherd...and how we will engage in all the incredible opportunities that God places before us using our time, our talents, and our financial resources.

"For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers; then deeds of power, then gifts of healing, forms of assistance, forms of leadership, various kinds of tongues." 1 Corinthians 12:13-14, 27-28

The above verses were written by the Apostle Paul. Paul wrote a number of letters to various congregations of the first Christians, and many of these letters have become part of the New Testament of the Bible. Again and again, Paul's letters stress the idea that through BAPTISM each Christian has been blessed with certain gifts that contribute to the ongoing work of the church. We do not all have the same gifts and abilities, and some of us may even possess more gifts than others, but NO ONE has ALL the gifts necessary to be the church by him/herself.



# **Called to Baptismal Living Letter**

(Sunday, January 31, marked the milestone of celebrating our own youth as they affirm their baptism through the rite of confirmation. As we can see and read the signs all around us, there has never been a more important time to lean into our callings. The letter below was drafted and shared by this ecumenical group. Bishop Anne Edison-Albright is the newly elected Bishop of our North East Synod of Wisconsin of the ELCA.

#### Dear Friends,

Like so many, we watched in appalled disbelief Wednesday as we witnessed a mob overrun the Capitol building and disrupt our elected leaders as they sought to perform their constitutional duty. We condemn this assault on our democracy. It is contrary to the principles we claim to value as a nation. More significantly for us as church leaders, it was utterly contrary to the way of Jesus Christ.

This Sunday, members of our several traditions will be hearing again the account of Jesus' baptism. Among other things, that baptism symbolizes Jesus immersing himself in the murky stream of human history with all its violent divisiveness in order to bring healing, justice, and reconciliation.

Though we represent different Christian traditions we are united by our common baptism which unites us to Jesus and to one another. Using similar language, those who are baptized into the church renounce evil and commit themselves to the way of Jesus — the way of his love, his joy, his peace. We call on the members of our churches to remember and reflect on their baptisms and the promises made there. May we live into those promises and pursue healing, justice, and reconciliation.

## **Reimagining Worship**

Your Reimagining Worship Task Force has continued to meet and are currently following Bishop Anne Edison-Albright's request that individual church staff and lay leaders provide worship in the safest possible manner (online) for our congregation. We continue to monitor local and statewide rates of infection and encourage our family and friends to wash their hands frequently, wear a mask and stay socially distanced. We are looking forward to late spring in hopes that we will be able to provide regular worship opportunities outdoors. We continue to provide drive by communion opportunities each Wednesday from 1-2 pm and from 6-7 pm and each Sunday between 9-10 am. You may request extra communion elements for family members or friends who find it difficult to get out. We will be providing WeCare Bags in mid-February and welcome volunteers to help deliver these to our elders and shut-ins. If you would like to help, please call MJ Horvat at 715-205-9195.

#### **Get Your Covid-19 Vaccination**

One of the most important way we can help get our church life back to normal is to get vaccinated against Covid-19. If you are age 65 or older or a front line health worker you are eligible for a vaccination. The Wisconsin Council of Churches recommends that we encourage each other to get vaccinated as quickly as possible. You may want to register in more than one place to increase the possibility that you get an appointment in a timely manner. You can register for a vaccination by phone with Aspirus at 715-847-2812 and press 2 when given options. You can register for a vaccination by phone with Marshfield clinic at 877-998-0880. Both Marshfield and Aspirus also offer online registration. Your primary care physician or pharmacy may also be taking registrations for vaccinations. If you believe you are eligible, but are having problems maneuvering the registration process we have volunteers who will help you. Leave your name and number with Angie at the church office and one of our volunteers will call to help you. Due to overwhelming volume, expect that the line will be hard to get through and at times, even go down. Be patient and show grace!

- Treasurer / Financial Report Cory (November income was \$68,753 expenses were \$22,050. We transferred \$2,322 of funds so the total net income was \$49,025. Current reserves are \$34,969 in the general fund, \$12,954 in the building fund, and \$13,236 in work of the church.

It is anticipated that the PPP loan of \$41,500 will be forgiven. Forgiveness application is complete and submitted. The PPP loan amount was moved from a liability into income, which is reflected in our large November income reported. Our mortgage lender has allowed for interest-only payments during the pandemic crisis, which allowed for the \$2,332 transfer noted above.) - Heidi / Dorie APPROVED

#### Our Response to the Word

Mission Outreach - Christmas Eve Worship Community Gift - Building upon the shining example of Good Shepherd's 'warp-speed' Thanksgiving turkey feast distribution, and recognizing the horrendous additional impact of Covid-19 on our area's suffering homeless as winter sets in, Council will work with our congregation to provide warm socks, hats, mittens, gloves, masks and non-perishable food to be collected through and culminating on Christmas Eve. A MOTION to collaborate with Marathon County homelessness organizations to place these gifts in the hands of our homeless sisters and brothers was offered by Steve / seconded by Dorie and unanimously and enthusiastically approved.

(old business)

- <u>Christmas Eve Worship Council Member's Beloved Hymn Debut</u>: In recognition of the beloved tradition of singing
  'Silent Night' as part of Christmas Eve Worship, under the direction of Dr. Kartika Putri, councilmembers will record a virtual
  rendition of 'Silent Night' to be offered during the two Christmas Eve services.
- 'Annual Meeting during a pandemic' planning Following synod suggestions and intense research by Pastor Kemp, carefully implemented to adhere to our Good Shepherd Constitution, the 2021 Annual Meeting will follow a hybrid format building on Zoom virtual technology and telephone attendance to carry out the vital communication and decision making for the coming year. Every congregant will have the opportunity to 'hear and be heard.' Notification efforts begin immediately following Christmas.
- <u>Stewardship for All Seasons & Strategic Planning update</u> Dorie As of meeting time, 50 annual pledges have been received promising \$124,271. For comparison, last year's final tally was 103 pledges summing up to \$216,989. Efforts to remind those remaining are underway.
- 2021 Church Council candidates and leadership update January will represent the final meeting of the 2020 GSLC Church Council. This will mark the end of this term for Dorie and Tim. Their contributions have been immeasurable. Alternative safe formats for this final meeting are under review, hoping to allow more cordiality to recognize them. We presently have willing candidates for all leadership positions and are actively recruiting candidates for council-at-large.
