Welcome to November!

I happened upon an article this week that indicated that according to surveys, the number of cupholders in a car is a more significant buying factor for consumers purchasing a vehicle than the miles per gallon. The 2020 Subaru Assent SUV has 19. The point? Multiple cupholders have become a foregone conclusion for car buyers. Whether it is a Ford or a Ferrari, we care less about what's under the hood than having plenty of in-vehicle real estate to stow our Starbucks. It's all about the accessories! That's interesting ... and it makes me curious.

Is the church also more interested in accessories than we are with what's under the hood? Watching trends in US churches would seem to indicate to me that overall that our conversations seem a lot more focused on cupholders than on Jesus. We are hanging on to "what we have always known" and trying to re-package it in new techniques and philosophies and approaches that excite because they are new or hip or edgy or intellectually stimulating ... but they are actually quite boring when set next to the person of Jesus.

A consultant I follow put it like this (apologies for the lengthy quote): "Actually, I don't think it's a good idea at all to 'hang on to what we know.' I think we're now at a place where we're so comfortable with Jesus, so confident of who He is and what He's like, that a lot of 'what we know is actually wrong. We've kind of lost interest in Him (though we'd never admit that), like a married couple in midlife. We think we pretty much have him pegged—all the things we like and all the things that have been bugging us about Him for years. We've been married a long time to Jesus and have gone through a lot together. But one of the marriage partners—the church—is sort of looking around for something to spark our passions because we're past the 'passionate curiosity stage with Jesus. So, we turn to the 'form and function' of doing church as our mid-marriage splurge—like letting ourselves get involved in an emotional affair to rouse us from our relational boredom. If we're not awake to this dynamic, our 'marriage' could descend into deadness and a sense of growing isolation. We'll literally live under the same roof with Jesus but live separate lives, functionally apart from Him." – Rick Lawrence, Executive Director of Vibrant Faith

I'm not sure I am ready to grind axes about this yet, but it certainly makes me want to reflect on it a bit more. My understanding from what I read and hear is that what most all people – young and old – are hungering for today is Jesus. We seem to all share a deep need for this kind of connection with the Savior. Further, this is a true reflection of what the generation called "Z" is said to be seeking as well. When they think of their connection (or lack of) to church, they indicate that the thing they would be most interested in talking with a ministry leader about is this: "Getting a better understanding of what Jesus really said and did, and how faith in him matters in my own life."

Honestly, that could truly change the trajectory of the church, both now and into the future. It would probably even secure the future. But we have to be ready and willing to accept that we have been paying more attention to the cup-holders than the motor that is under our hood.

What a gift that all future generations at Good Shepherd would know the true, life-changing love of God in Jesus! What are you willing to do to make that happen?

That's where it all begins.

July income was \$15,628, expenses were \$22,784. We transferred \$1,511 from the building fund for a negative \$5,645 in total net income. Current reserves are \$66,075 (\$35,675 is PPP) in the general fund, \$24,757 in the building fund, and \$13,333 in work of the church. The monthly transfer from the building fund covers the mortgage and snow removal. These funds come in via monthly contributions designated to the building fund (income) and we then transfer them out (expense).– Paul / M.J. - APPROVED

Our Response to the Word

(old business)

- <u>GSLC Family Call List Project</u> The pandemic has interfered with many of our normal interactions with our fellow GSLC family. Council
 members are each asked to touch base with about 3D of our Church family, as per a pre-assigned list, and share goodwill and connection. We
 can inform everyone about in-person Worship, upcoming Sunday School and Confirmation and the coming return to two services and answer
 any questions which might arise. Be mindful of any expressed interest in Church leadership such as a Council position. We will try to contact
 everyone within a timeframe of four to eight weeks.
- <u>Church Council Membership Rollover and Candidates</u> Our present best estimate based on completion of terms is that four positions will become open for the 2022 Church Council. Current Council members are asked to prayerfully consider their service and keep an open mind for those in our church family who might bring valuable gifts to the upcoming Church Council.
- <u>Fall Stewardship</u> The third meeting with Stewardship consultant Peter Reuss is slated for this week. Planning for this Fall's Stewardship is coalescing around a shift from printed communication to video content, holding up the theme of 'Our Love for Our Church.' Ten short videos will be produced and made available, beginning next week, with members of GSLC briefly sharing the story of what they value in their relationship with Good Shepherd. The Committee seeks ideas for a primary tangible cause to lift up, in the format of "Supporting Ministerial Excellence and ______. Better Than Ever." November 14th is the planned commitment date for stewardship pledges. Of special, pressing, vital concern is the

need for lay leadership to join the Stewardship Committee.

(new business)

- <u>2022 Budget</u> Paul presented the pro forma 2022 budget as developed by the Finance Committee. Adjustments of note, varying from 2021 include: the addition of a High Deductible Health Savings Account option to staff health benefits, a large annual drop in mortgage loan expense, adjustments for the completion of concrete work and audio / video infrastructure budgeted expenses for 2021, and a reduction in administrative wage expense. Budgeted contributions was also reduced to reflect the unfortunate reality of some downward giving trends. Budget planning will continue to hone the budget for later Council approval.
- <u>Snow Cancellation procedure development</u> A procedure is in development to codify the steps to be taken in the event of weather necessitating cancellation of services for safety reasons.
- <u>Basketball Hoop</u> Council agreed that the broken basketball backboard in out back parking lot should be replaced. Signage inviting all to it's use was discussed.
- <u>Re-Visiting Our Vision, Mission</u> Council tabled this topic until next meeting, for time constraints.
