

- 3. Someone told me the head count during the service was 136 people!
- 4. There were many helping hands with set-up, serving, and clean-up.
- 5. I got the report that there was a little over \$280 in cash plus a check for \$100 to be sent to the Alzheimer's Association!

There were about 80 people, including helpers, who ate the lunch after the service. We had more food than we needed. Extra drinks, cookies, chips, and open containers of potato salad were donated to the homeless shelter.

- 6. The signage was excellent in my opinion as were the decorations people could put up on the memory wall. Thanks to Linda Konkol for sharing table decorations with us. It was purely a coincidence that they were available and they were a PERFECT match for the theme of honoring those with Alzheimer's.
- 6. In my opinion, except for a couple of days before and after the service, the event ran itself. We had one meeting and everyone took their tasks and ran with them.
- 7. Thanks to Linda Konkol and a member from Good Shepherd who each got Thrivent Action Team grants that were used for signage and for food.
- 8. The availability of face painting was great fun. I got my face painted for the first time ever! I was surprised how fast Angle was able to do it and how much I enjoyed it.

There is one thing I wish would have worked more smoothly and that is having enough brats and dogs ready before the lunch so some people didn't have to wait for them.

It's unfortunate that Jim Yunek was not able to be present because I'm sure he would have added some flair to the music after the service but there's no getting in the way of medical emergencies that need immediate attention.

GOOD SHEPHERD TASK FORCE UPDATE... JUNE, 25 2025

The Good Shepherd task force met on June 3; the task force members were invited to attend the council meeting on June 10 to share updates and insights. Our original task was to research and respond to St Stephen's request to merge or consolidate. After 18 months of time, hundreds of hours of meeting and much learning, discerning and discussion, the task force presented their opinions that while we must and want to continue to work and share ministries with the other area ELCA congregations, the time does not seem appropriate for merging with SS. There is still much work to be done, both internally and outside of the GS walls. We will be looking for ways to best use our task force accumulated knowledge as we work to plan our next steps and tasks.



Task Force Update

Summary: Approximately 18 months ago, a six-person Task Force was commissioned to explore the potential of merging or consolidating with another local ELCA congregation (St. Stephen). The Task Force members are: Kay Walters, JoAnn Grewe, Paul Grewe, Mike Sturzenegger, Laurie Sturzenegger, and Jennifer Holcomb.

After many hours of meetings, listening sessions, exploration, and so on, the Task Force's assessment is that a merge/consolidation with St. Stephen seems not to be a viable option for Good Shepherd at this time and that we should stop pursuing that goal for the near term. However, we would and should remain open to future opportunities [with St Stephen and/or other congregations] provided congregational needs and visions align, and the work of the greater church can be advanced. The Task Force also recommends that collaborative work around community service and joint worship experiences **should continue to happen** [possibly even grow], as we have learned over the past few years that we truly are better together! Lastly, the Task Force recommends a visionary team be created to focus on the future (historically, a "Forward Planning" committee has been part of our structure - perhaps it is time to bring that concept back into play).

The GPS (Good Shepherd, Pilgrim, St Stephen) Task Force has decided to take a break over the summer and will be meeting again in late September. The current six-member Good Shepherd Task Force will remain in effect until the September GPS meeting. The current plan is that the October Council meeting will include a follow-up from the GPS meeting. Council discussion relative to future work/plans/opportunities will continue.

April Treasurer/Financial Report

Group reviewed financials - Contributions for April were \$17,740. Expenses for April were \$21,950, resulting in a loss of \$2,699 for the month after mortgage transfer. Several expenses were higher than typical due to how transactions occurred. It was also a three-payroll month.

- f) Working on Supply Pastor rotation for fall.
- g) Garden boxes the group who asked about this opportunity appreciated feedback presented and will continue to explore other ways to meet perceived food insecurity needs.

- 2) US flag in the building it will remain where it is currently positioned.
- 3) Synod Educational Opportunity the Synod has a specialist who can offer some Council education around leadership and governance. Motion to proceed with scheduling this free opportunity (MSC: Martell/Jauch)
- 4) Social Media policy Emily J offered to draft a policy for social media management thank you!
- 5) Noisy offering Recommended Pastors Fund for <u>September</u>; Support for our Cleaning Team for <u>October</u>; focus on Thanksgiving meal provision (specific organization TBD) in <u>November</u>; Wausau/Marathon County Shelter for <u>December</u>.

Treasurer's Report May 2025 Council Meeting June 10, 2025

Contributions for May were \$17,740. The average giving for May is \$22,875 or 9.77% of the annual giving and budgeted amount is \$24,428. Contributions are \$5,135 or 22.4% under average and \$6,688 under budget.

Giving for 2025 is at \$135,187 compared to \$107,842 budgeted which is \$23,589 ahead of budget still. If giving the rest of the year would be similar to past averages we would be around \$268,000 compared to our budgeted amount of \$250,000 but the last two months have been nearly 20% below average.

Expenses for the month are only \$792 over budget at \$21,950.

- Pastoral Salaries Supply minister was only \$600 for May. Looking at the details it shows Pastor Natalie wasn't paid for Sun 5/18 and no pastor paid for 5/25. May was a 3 payroll month (5/2, 5/16, 5/30) so minister of music, admin and payroll taxes show higher than budgeted but overall for the year salaries are on budget.
- Professional services (#5490) \$2,495 for May which is more than double budget. Kerber Rose was paid \$2165 in May, April was \$1415, March \$0, Feb \$1435, Jan \$440. I'm still not sure what 'normal' is for the billing but for Jan-May professional service is \$1,542 over budget.
- Comprehensive Insurance (#5480) Church Mutual is normally \$830 a month but sometimes comes through the 1st and last day of the month and then shows double the next month so no expense for May.
- Utilities (#5630) \$21,575 is budgeted for utilities for the year and split up evenly at \$1,798 per month. May was only \$928 which shows as \$869 under budget but utilities are naturally more in winter and certain months are less.

For the month, ordinary income shows a loss of \$4,210. Adding in the transfer of \$1511 from the building fund to cover the mortgage payment the loss was \$2,699. Year to date net income is \$34,664 ahead of budget. Without the \$46,000 donation it would be a loss of around \$11,336 for the year.
