

**History of the U.S. Flag**

- 1777: On June 14, the Continental Congress passed a resolution establishing the first official U.S. flag with 13 stripes and 13 stars, often known as the "Betsy Ross" flag.
- 1795-1818: Following the addition of new states, the flag had 15 stripes and 15 stars. It was this flag that inspired the writing of "The Star-Spangled Banner".
- 1818: Congress returned the flag to 13 stripes to honor the original colonies, decreeing that only stars should be added for new states.
- 1912: President Taft signed an executive order standardizing the proportions and arrangement of stars.
- 1960: The current 50-star flag was adopted following Alaska and Hawaii's statehood.
- June 14: Recognized annually as Flag Day
