## **?What is a Luau?**

In the Hawaiian language, the word "luau" translates to "young taro tops." This word was used in reference to a food dish, usually chicken or squid baked in coconut milk and taro. Luau is a traditional Hawaiian food which was served at an ahaaina, or feast. Around the 1850s, the word luau came to represent the feast where the food – taro tops – was served. Over time, and influenced by advertisers, the word began to represent a gathering meal of food, music, and dancing.
