JAMESTOWN — A Jamestown woman is the only North Dakota resident featured in a new coffee table book recently published featuring the wisdom of 90 people over the age of 90.

"Wisdom of the Century" features people who were in Florida, and Betty Brosz happened to be in Florida and was recommended to interview, said Jenny Menzel, Aberdeen, South Dakota, one of the four collaborators on the book. Brosz spends me with her daughter's family, Roxane and Russ Madio and their children, in Florida during the winter months.

"She's an incredible woman, over 90 years old and still working," Menzel said of Brosz.

Brosz is currently employed part-time as a meal time assistant at SMP Health-Ave Maria. She has worked there since May of 1965, according to Ave Maria records, and for most of that time was a certified nursing assistant.

Book collaborators in addition to Menzel are Sandra Coiffman, founder; Merle R. Saferstein, author, and Pipe Yanguas, photographer.

On New Year's Day, Menzel delivered a copy of the book to Brosz in Jamestown. The book was launched on Dec. 12 at the HistoryMiami Museum in Miami, and Menzel said Brosz's photo is featured at an exhibit on in the museum through Feb. 16.
