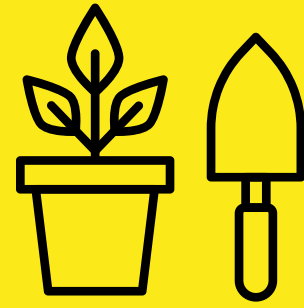


CHAZ AMOS

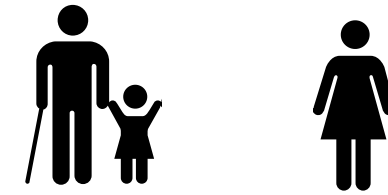
Vacant Properties & Homelessness

More than 11,000 housing units across Dayton sit empty, but over 550 people are still considered homeless.



Neglected Neighborhoods

Deteriorating properties and overgrown green spaces contribute to the decay of neighborhoods, discouraging investment.



Community Disengagement

A lack of resources and community engagement perpetuate generations of underdeveloped West Dayton communities.

Program Offerings

Comprehensive beautification and development efforts focusing on the environmental and social dimensions of the West Dayton area (Westwood, Greenwich Village, Dayton View). These efforts will inspire community reinvestment and revitalization.



Vacant Property Redevelopment

Provide housing to homeless veterans in the community through the rehabilitation of vacant homes.



Neighborhood Beautification

Transform neighborhood green spaces and curb appeal, promoting the vibrancy of street life and cultural civic engagement.



Community Development

Support the economic self-sufficiency of the community through personal and professional development programming.



Vacant Housing Redevelopment

ILWD Project No Place Like Home

\$100,000

Acquire vacant homes in West Dayton, rehabilitate them, and provide housing for homeless veterans. A two-fold effort of redeveloping local neighborhoods and housing veterans who make up 17% of the homeless population.

This capital will provide structure for supplies, labor costs, and other general costs that are associated with the initiative. Project NPLH will generate revenue to sustain future projects in West Dayton.



Neighborhood Beautification

ILWD Project Curb Appeal

The complete transformation of West Dayton streets through de-weeding, painting, mowing, and removing items from curbsides and storm drain systems.

ILWD Project Growth

The development of neighborhood locations for children to play and people to gather through the creation and repairment of natural features in vacant lot spaces, further improving the social and economic quality of life.



Community Development

Workforce Development / Dayton Public Schools

To provide programs and services that ensure the readiness of youth and adults to pursue paths of economic self-sufficiency. These efforts include mentorship programming, personal and professional development, employability and skills trainings, and career exploration.

In partnership with *Dayton Public Schools* and *Montgomery County Job & Family Services (Youthworks)*, students have the opportunity to earn a seal towards graduation, learn new skills, take care of their own neighborhoods, and be paid up to 20 hours per week.

Impact

Since our launch in 2020, our network of over 700 volunteers has helped to create meaningful and lasting impact throughout West Dayton.



Volume

ILWD has removed over 300 thousand pounds of bulk and waste.



Service

Individuals from across the city have fulfilled over 1,500 hours of community service.

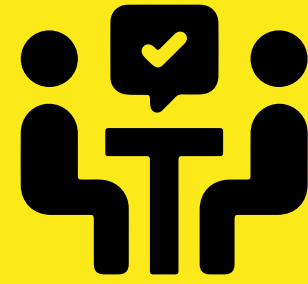


Area
