Public Notice to Major Fiber Internet Providers and Their Executive Leadership

**Re: Request for Immediate Review of Business
Relationships with Beyond Pro in the Interest of
Public Welfare**

To the executive leadership of all major fiber
internet providers, broadband companies, and network
operators:

This letter serves as a public request that every
provider conducting business with Beyond Pro
immediately review whether continuing that
relationship is consistent with your company's ethical
standards, supplier policies, and public commitments.

Based on information gathered through ongoing
investigative journalism, interviews, contracts,
recordings, and complaints from individuals working
within the fiber sales industry, serious questions
have been raised regarding the treatment of
independent sales representatives, installation
technicians, and, in some reported instances, underage
sales workers participating in door-to-door programs.

This Causational Journalism story represents more than an ordinary contract dispute. Rather the incontrovertible public evidence, corroborated by a wide variety of victim classes, reflect a business environment that contributes to significant financial hardship, emotional distress, and legal exposure for everyone involved in the sales chain. A monumental example of legal agency. Candidly, your telecoms are directly financially off the pain and suffering business model of Beyond Pro and other predatory operators, NSPs and sales channels.

The reported concerns include:

- Nonpayment of delayed payment of earned commissions
- Retaliation against sales representatives who raise concerns
- Withholding of compensation following completed sales
- Overt violations of Idaho labor laws
- Probable crimes of extortion; fraudulent schemes
- Reports of technicians receiving late, reduced, or disputed compensation
- Social Media posts from concerned mothers involving recruitment and treatment of teenagers participating in sales programs that warrant careful review under applicable state and federal labor laws
- Possible human trafficking involving underage sales recruits scheme inception online 2019, involving Bryce Baker of Clearhome Services, LLC and Beyond Pro of Idaho

Every sales lead issued to Beyond Pro supports these unethical and seemingly illegal/criminal business practices, and have the potential to create additional victims. Those victims may include families depending on commission income, technicians waiting to be paid for completed installations, and young workers entering the workforce expecting honesty and fair treatment.

Whether every allegation is ultimately substantiated is a matter for the appropriate authorities. However, the volume and nature of the complaints warrant serious due diligence by every provider that entrusts customer relationships to third-party sales organizations...IMMEDIATELY.

Accordingly, providers could:

- Conduct independent audits of Beyond Pro's compensation and compliance practices
- Review complaints submitted by current and former sales representatives and installers
- Evaluate whether supplier agreements and codes of conduct have been violated
- Suspend or reevaluate new lead distribution if credible evidence indicates ongoing harm while reviews are underway
- Cooperate fully with any governmental or law enforcement inquiries

Large telecommunications providers regularly emphasize integrity, customer trust, and responsible business practices. Those values should extend throughout every level of the sales channel—not only to customers, but also to the people generating sales and installing services.

The public has an interest in ensuring that companies benefiting from taxpayer-supported infrastructure and serving millions of Americans maintain supply chains that value transparency, accountability, and lawful treatment of workers.
