Electricity has been connected, and the overhead door has been repaired. Board member, David Prill, found 8 cabinets at a sale that will be utilized in the building. Progress continues, and plans for the office and genealogy archives are being made for the front section of the building.

WALTER O. KIENAS Since the Society has purchased the Kienas Building, information about Walter Kienas is pertinent to historians. Mr. Kienas attended Berlin schools and the School of Engineering in Milwaukee. He married Mary Godfrey in 1934. In 1945, Mr. & Mrs. Kienas moved to Markesan where he assumed ownership of the International Harvester dealership. He was active in the business for 12 years. Since leaving the implement business, he had operated Kienas Floral and Nursery in Markesan. He was active in civic affairs and served the city as mayor for 10 years. During his tenure as mayor, he was instrumental in the building of Riverdale Manor Nursing Home in 1961 and the Lanterns Supper Club in 1968. He was an honorary member of the Central Wisconsin Small Cities Association; Green Lake County Deputy Sheriffs Association: and a member of the Markesan Chamber of Commerce.
