### Youth

### **Covid Response**

Municipal leaders were challenged with a response to the once-in-a-century pandemic commonly known as COVID-19, the infectious disease that caused the death of millions worldwide.

Mayor Alsberry and the Board of Trustees acted quickly to implement safeguards to protect first responders, village employees, and residents.

The pandemic caused the virtual shutdown of the national economy and the loss of tax revenues impacted municipal governments. Even so, the Board of Trustees assured that essential services continued to be provided. This was true for maintaining water services while many residents were laid off from work and unable to make timely payments for municipal services.

Village leaders took proactive actions to assist residents of the village and surrounding communities by making COVID-19 testing available at municipal facilities, testing which was essential to check the spread of the disease. Additionally, village leaders provided a facility for the Hazel Crest Veterans Commission to provide fresh nutritional foods and sanitation products to residents of the village and other communities.

Village Board meetings were held virtually, and resident input was provided via Facebook, hence the village maintained its connection with the community and continued to provide information concerning the pandemic, village, county, and state services. Also, the village staff provided masks, gloves, and food to residents for the holiday season. The resourcefulness of The Board of Trustees and management during the very difficult days of the pandemic is not to be discounted.

# **Police Department**

- Chief of Police Mitchell R. Davis, III selected as Chief of Police
- The village of Hazel Crest Police Academy began with the graduation of 30 residents and business owners.
- Deployed undercover police officers to apprehend criminals engaged in a rash of armed robberies and possession of stolen handguns.
- Hazel Crest Police Officers conducted a successful investigation to stop the sale and distribution of narcotics within areas of the south suburbs.
- Chief of Police Mitchell R. Davis, III was selected as the 2018 Chief of Police of the Year by the Illinois State Crime Commission.
- In 2018 Chief of Police Mitchell R. Davis, III was elected 3rd Vice President of the Illinois Association of Chiefs of Police, he was the first African American in the 77-year history of the organization to hold an elected position
- In 2018 Chief of Police Mitchell R Davis, III was elected President of the SouthSuburban Association of Chiefs of Police
- In 2020 there were 3 homicides within the Village, all three were solved by the Detective Division
- Detective Malik Matariyeh was promoted to Squad Leader on the South Suburban Major Crimes Task Force
- Deputy Chief Oldenburg led the accreditation process through the Illinois Law Enforcement Accreditation Program (ILEAP).
- The Village of Hazel Crest honored Chief of Police Mitchell R. Davis, III, for his service as President of the Illinois Association of Chiefs of Police, the first African American to serve in the position; he was also honored for his service to the Illinois Legislature in the development of the Illinois Criminal Justice Reform Act.
