## 4.1 Disclosure in Suit for Divorce or Annulment:

- 1. All documents pertaining to real estate.
- 2. All documents pertaining to any pension, retirement, profitsharing, or other employee benefit plan, together with the most recent account statement for any plan.
- 3. All documents pertaining to any life, casualty, liability and health insurance.
- 4. The most recent account statement pertaining to any account located with any financial institution including, but not limited to, banks, savings and loans, credit union, and brokerage firms.

## 4.4.2 Disclosure in Suit In Which Child or Spousal Support is in Issue:

- 1. All policies, statements and benefits which reflect any and all medical and health insurance coverage that is or would be available for the child or the spouse.
- 2. Unless the information has been previously exchanged in connection with a temporary hearing (Rule 4.1), a financial information statement together with the previous two years income tax returns and two most recent payroll check stubs, or, if no payroll check stubs are available, latest Form W-2.
