

4.1 Disclosure in Suit for Divorce or Annulment:

1. All documents pertaining to real estate.
2. All documents pertaining to any pension, retirement, profit-sharing, or other employee benefit plan, together with the most recent account statement for any plan.
3. All documents pertaining to any life, casualty, liability and health insurance.
4. The most recent account statement pertaining to any account located with any financial institution including, but not limited to, banks, savings and loans, credit union, and brokerage firms.

4.4.2 Disclosure in Suit In Which Child or Spousal Support is in Issue:

1. All policies, statements and benefits which reflect any and all medical and health insurance coverage that is or would be available for the child or the spouse.
2. Unless the information has been previously exchanged in connection with a temporary hearing (Rule 4.1), a financial information statement together with the previous two years income tax returns and two most recent payroll check stubs, or, if no payroll check stubs are available, latest Form W-2.
