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## Deaf Awareness Week Celebrations

Deaf Awareness Week at PDSD and ASDB Tucson was an unforgettable celebration of Deaf culture, brimming with activities that brought the community together and inspired students to connect with their heritage in meaningful ways. The week kicked off on September 23rd with an inspiring ASL film screening in the BPAC, setting the stage for a series of engaging events. That same day, students took center stage to present on PDSD's rich history, sharing stories about their favorite Deaf or hard-of-hearing role models who have paved the way for future generations.

The excitement continued on September 24th with a Deaf career panel featuring accomplished professionals from diverse fields. Students were inspired to dream big as they explored career paths uniquely accessible to them. Later, the K-12 ASL Contest lit up the room with expressive ASL poetry performances, where students wowed the judges with their creativity and linguistic flair.

September 25th brought the chance to create with ASL artist Jennifer Tandoc, who led an art workshop where students expressed themes of self-love and learned about her journey as an artist. The artistic energy rolled into September 26th, as students immersed themselves in the beauty of ASL poetry, creating stories with playful ABC and 123 narratives alongside staff and peers.

The week wrapped up with a whirlwind of events on September 27th, starting with a lively paint night led by Deaf mentors and capped off with a thrilling performance by Justin Perez. Guests Justin Perez and Ruthie Jordan also hosted a Deaf literature and vernacular workshop, where students explored language through games and challenges that kept everyone engaged and laughing.

Finally, the celebrations came to a grand close on September 28th with a vibrant ceremony at ASDB Tucson. Deaf sponsors and vendors filled the space, emphasizing the power of community and the importance of raising awareness. The week was a joyful reminder of the strength, beauty, and vibrancy of Deaf culture—an experience no one will soon forget!

ASDB Tucson Campus students recently took part in two impactful environmental learning experiences. ASB and ASD high school students visited the Santa Cruz River, where they explored the vital ecosystem and discussed the importance of maintaining the river's environment. Meanwhile, Project WET, in partnership with the University of Arizona, conducted a session on campus, teaching students about water conservation and the workings of groundwater in our desert landscape.

### Operations

On May 9th, the ASDB board approved the master facility plan, including conceptual drawings and the consolidation of the Tucson campus into a new building. Funds have been requested for FY 2026. The vote did not address land or building sales, transfers, or leases. The final plan will be posted on ASDB's website in August.

ASDB's fleet will now be under ADOT's ownership, following state legislature changes. ADOT confirmed no major operational changes, but they will handle all vehicle claims.
