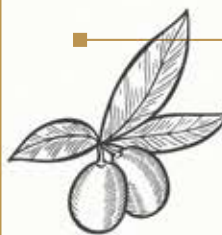
Thin size corned beef, sauerkraut, drizzle glaze, fontina cheese on a toasted marble rye bread
