Patch Marbles



It looks like a different color was brushed on one side of the marble, like a dab of fingernail polish.

Cat Eyes



Eye-shaped ribbons from pole to pole, inside a clear base, with "vanes" that look like fan blades.

Opaque Swirls



Opaque Swirls have swirling ribbons twisting and turning all over the surface of the marble.

Cut-line Marbles



Older marbles may have cut-lines, sometimes called "seams", which divide colors or double ribbons.

Patch Marbles

Cat Eyes
