Those are the reasons we're here today," said Levi Bachmeier, Policy Advisor to Governor Burgum.

Protest leader Chase Iron Eyes among others gathered at Cannonball Bridge this afternoon to make their voices heard. "We have to dig deep right now. This is unfolding right now," said Chase Iron Eyes, protest leader.

One of their main arguments was against leaving the campgrounds for potential flooding. "I don't care what anybody says, I'm going to stay," one protester said. "They're saying that we're going to be forcefully removed from our own land!," said another protester.

However, authorities insisted that the reason for evacuation is to keep residents safe. "Our goal is that everyone peacefully leaves," said Alan Dohrmann, North Dakota's Adjutant General.

Still, protesters were adamant this afternoon that they're staying - even if it means they'll be arrested. "This has always been our land, it will always be our land," said Ladonna Allard, protest leader.

At this time, no change has been made to the evacuation date of February 22nd.
