Guidelines to Follow when Reopening

No More than 20 people at your club at the one time. You may need to organise a schedule with your club members.

Please stay away from your club if you are feeling unwell.

> Practice Butt Procedures with 1.5 m physical distancing:

- o An archer cannot touch another archer's equipment
- All archers to pull their own arrows
- o Only one archer per target, unless they are of the same household
- Only every second lane should be in use to further encourage physical distancing
- Enclosed clubhouses should not be open, unless they are needed to access toilets

Field Archery Procedures with 1.5 m physical distancing:

- An archer cannot touch another archer's equipment
- o Only two archers per target lane, unless they are of the same household
- All archers to pull their own arrows.
- Enclosed clubhouses should not be open, unless they are needed to access toilets

As of 13thJune clubs with Indoor Archery ranges will be able to recommence shooting. The restrictions include:-

- 10 people per class
- 4 square metre rule to apply at all times
- The shooting line must accommodate 1.5 metre distancing between each archer.
- Hand sanitiser should be made available at each club.
- The club must ensure that sanitiser spray is available to spray all surfaces.
- If you are using hire equipment this must be sanitised prior to and after use.
- All archers attending must sanitise their equipment also prior to and after use.
- If Parents/guardians are allowed to stay on the range to supervise children, they must adhere to the physical distancing measures.
- Hand sanitiser should be made available at each club.
- Archers should practice safe hygiene at all times, including washing hands for at least 20 seconds before and after any archery activity.
- Parents/guardians are allowed to stay on the range to supervise children, however they must adhere to the physical distancing measures
- The responsibility lies with individual Archery Club and members to ensure they are fully aware of and compliant with their own State Government legislation and Federal Government Legislation.
