[Writer's Note: This letter was written in response to the New York Legislature's ban on militia rifles. This ban was done very quickly, two months, after the Newtown, Connecticut Shooting. As I have said before, usurpers always bring about or select times of trouble to get passed under cover of the public terror, destructive liberty robbing laws, which the People would never adopt upon deliberate debate and reflection.]

A well regulated militia being necessary for the security of a free state, the right of the People to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed. These are words not only to live by, but to die for. All right thinking men and women must know their liberty is under direct attack by the reprobates in New York that are in power. With a manly commitment to liberty, we must act—we must do something to take back our liberty. We must open a front by filing a lawsuit challenging these scoundrels new means of oppression. We cannot and must not sit around hoping some other New Yorker does something to overturn this most destructive blow to the liberty of all citizens of New York State. Nothing can be at once more stupid and more wicked than this militia rifle ban; and in no way should it be tolerated by a free nation.

Andrew Cuomo is the greatest liar amongst men. He speaks with a cloven tongue of falsehood, trying to deceive the People with baseless reasoning. All that he says with regards to the right to bear arms is quite false, and said without authority or reason. He speaks with lavish words that are empty of substance. I trust not, that there is no one, at least in his right mind, who would not admit that we are approaching the threshold where the dogs of war can be heard beginning to growl. But before we appeal to heaven, we must first exhaust our appeals on earth. We do not have a right to insurrection, but we do have a Right to Revolution, as it is enshrined in our foundational document-The Declaration of Independence. If this heinous act of disarmament of the citizens militia is not annulled, then we are left no choice but to appeal to the remedy our venerable ancestors have shown us works.

My fellow concerned citizens, think of it this way. We the People are bees. Individually we are weak and impotent, and not operating in our sovereign capacity. But united we become a formidable adversary to our enemy. Our hive is the Bill of Rights. The honey within the hive is the Second Amendment, without which the hive has no sustenance. Only then, when the courts too, have acquiesced in the disarmament of our militias, by ignoring our natural right to bear arms as enshrined in the Second Amendment, can we constitute our position of having been forced to undertake a war in our just and lawful defense. The social contract enshrined our unalienable right to bear arms, which is the root and source of our liberty. The New York Assembly, Senate and Governor have usurped this ancient precedent which goes to the very core of the sovereign power of the People. The coming lawful war we will be forced to wage is nothing more than the

A government that acquires great power for itself to the destruction and ruin of the People should not be called government, but an enemy; as it does things which enemies do, such as attempt to disarm; which should not be appeased by any peace. For those who do harm under the guise of governing are worse than open enemies.

Can there be any question of the lawfulness of raising war against tyranny, in defense of our civil liberties and sovereignty? Such lawful war cannot be called an "insurrection" if we are fighting against a thing commanded, though established, is unlawful; and that we first sought all due means of redress; and then no man is further bound to the law. I understand the words I write are heavy to the mind. The truth is more than not disturbing. Yet digest my words for they spring from common sense and reason. Our minds must understand the who, what, where, when, and why with regards to our current circumstances. Otherwise the state media will attempt to keep our minds predisposed and focused on nonrelevant, inconsequential or inferior issues, all contrived to deceive. Unfortunately, many of our fellow citizens have fallen under the spell of the state media.

What these unprincipled and unscrupulous New York Politicians have done is nothing short of treason. These same politicians, who, impelled by the stupid and half-insane spirit of faction based in self-interest, would hurry our land into revolution. Socialism's tenet requires a disarmed populace. The Government of New York State as well as many others, have lost its purpose as measured by the touchstone of liberty. The enemies of the Second Amendment have been agitating for generations. And this agitation has recently reached the point of nearing revolution in New York State. Any politician who wants to restrict a law abiding citizens' right to firearms, cannot sincerely be concerned about the public's safety and security. One cannot deny, that any restrictions having to do with the private ownership of militia firearms are correlative to a lose of liberty. We cannot escape the fact that our liberty is directly contributable to the private ownership of militia firearms. If the People can be incrementally deprived of their force of arms by government, then the People cannot and will not maintain their sovereignty over their government. If the People are not able to sufficiently and properly equip themselves with arms needed to defeat oppressive government, then the People are bound to suffer the oppression. A People equipped with arms capable of resisting tyrannical government, liberty will survive, without them, liberty will surely wilt and die. For we know the oppressor never lets the oppressed go, without a fight.

Our position is one that morality will not let us retreat from and which principle will not let us compromise. The Second Amendment reminds the People they have the right to bear every type of firearm that is borne by the regular military. This principle was recognized by the U.S. Supreme Court in U.S. v. MILLER, 307 U.S. 174 (1939). There can be no compromise upon it. On this principle we must hold firm, as with a chain of steel.

Confronted with a common foe, the American People should, by the instinct of self-preservation, be united. The recent actions of certain governments must suffice to convince many who have formerly doubted the enemy's purpose of attacking the institution of the Second Amendment. The undying opposition to the private ownership of militia weapons in the United States means a war is being waged upon this vital institution of liberty; and our enemy will not stop until they have obliterated it.

Working with vast energy and singleness of purpose the People can always nullify an unpopular law by refusing to permit it to be enforced. Did the New York State Legislature expect they can pass incendiary legislation and not be taken to task for it? If there is a general submission now, there never will be future maintenance of our rights. The People of New York State will be



false to their rights if they fail to rebuke the enemy's lies. The American People as a whole must stand side by side with our brethren of New York. The People with a spirit erect and unbroken must defy the enemy's false assertions about the Second Amendment and anxiously await the triumph of the truth.

The banning of militia rifles in New York State has caused great excitement in the public mind. With the same madness Andrew Cuomo and his ignominious legislature passed this perfidious law, they believe the free People of New York are going to abide by it. Their madness has left them sadly mistaken. Revolution and violence is smoldering just below the surface. Doesn't the tyrant Cuomo know that well disciplined and armed militias stand as perpetual sentinels on the outposts of the Second Amendment? Patriots bearing arms in defense of their liberties is an exercise of the highest function of a free People. They are waiting to be made martyrs not by violence they attend but by the character of the government they attack. A government that is bent on enslaving then under socialism. Saint Tyranny don't you realize that you have the country of New York heading straight into unmeasured trouble?

The crisis inflicted on us is a grave one. Needed are dedicated men and women who want to preserve the principles of the Second Amendment in order that liberty may persevere. Knowing that New York State embodies a noble race of freemen, they will most assuredly commit themselves to the Second Amendment's necessary survival, not as a threat, but as an accomplished fact armed for lawful violence, being content to risk their lives.
