The older car in the background is my father's 1941 Chevrolet. After the war it costs him more that the "new" 1951 Chevrolet that he was able to purchase later. In those days one had to get on a list and when a car came into a dealer, you could buy it. No new cars were immediately available. How different it is today with so many to choose from.

Ihn Deutsche "Landers" (our tribal name) is "Länder". I am not sure what it means but I do know that my great grandad was born as registered at Hanover in Lower Saxony. My great grandmother was a Gallmeyer and was born at Westphaliarhine. John was seventeen when he came to Iowa via Chicago, Illinois and grandmother was only 3 when she came to the United States. My son Michael (35) has been doing some exploring on ancestry.com, and so he has filled in a couple blanks that I did not have. In a DNA test he found that he is 79% German, 19% Scandinavian and 2% of the Isles [England/Irish]. It seems that there are lots of Landers.

In the fall of 1993, Dana and I were looking for evidence of her heritage at the county cemetary in Carter County, Kentucky. While we did find evidence for her that was helpful, she discovered a plot in an older part of the cemetary where 22 Landers rested in one large plotting. Turned out they were all young men 16 to early 30s who had died in the period between 1861 and 1865 fighting for the Confederate States of America. A small world. I trust that spring is working its magic as the calendar rolls toward summer. Marz here, can be a bit of spring or a bit of winter. In Iowa it can even be more like winter than it is here in southern Indiana. Two of our adultchildren and their families live in Waterloo, Iowa. They can tell you about Iowa winters. As Nurnberg is further south, I imagine that your winters are milder than those in the North of Germany. Do the Alps play a role in your climate? I would love to spend some time there in the Alps, as I surely have been missing skiing. Perhaps the LORD will see fit for letting me one day enjoy such.

He has certainly blessed me with a diverse life experience so far. There are a number of lessons that can and are being learned even in the gulags. The poor things who are persecuting us have no clue what they are truly involved in.

Your friends Rudy and Erin must be very busy these days. It is good that they know that all is well here in Indiana and there is word that it is well in re to Ed and Elaine, as well. Our fellow traveler, Daniel is no doubt learning much about the ways of the world in the USA, as well. I'm sure the ones close to the fire are learning that Joe Stalin and others had nothing over on these in the USA who have turned a once free and blessed land into the land of false imprisonment for political expediency and undue financial gain. No room for being finger pointers as the USA has become Prison Planet for certain.

I have 13 grand children and 1 great grandaughter (Aug 2017) and only three have ever seen me. I have only seen photos of them. They are largely grown up now. Only 4 are not teenage yet. Two are 21 and 22. Yes! This is happeningin America. We have our Trablincas, etc. now. Two of my close friends have died

in them, and I know others who have died in them as well. One we know was poisoned. The death of Scot-Edward: Hildebrand at age 51 was suspicious, as well. This evil design is all too common.
