On 27 MARCH 2019, I mailed 22-inches of legal documents to Assistant Attorney General Meredith Beidler and Chapman Law Group in my ongoing medical lawsuit. These were exhibits in support of my answer to their Motions for Summary Judgment. They received my mail on 28 MARCH 2019. On 29 MARCH 2019, the WiFi receiver on my tablet opened at 0528 hours and my legal documents were downloaded from the tablet, then deleted. The clock came on after this, in the alarm mode, when I had not set the alarm but it is designed to notify of WiFi use.

Prisoners cannot use the WiFi. However, MDOC has an encoded backdoor where they can get into our tablets. This was likely a response to the Defense Counsels getting my mail. I now have to re-enter my answer to their Motions so I can file it a few weeks later than was planned.

Thankfully, I had sent out some documents so everything was not lost. My game plan has always been to have a few backups (Read the) >






