



# Biosecurity at the Show

Before the show on the farm

Biosecurity is achieved through practices that aim to prevent the entry and spread of diseases. Monitoring your birds at least 14 days before the show is a good idea. You know your birds better than anyone else, so spotting an ill bird should be simple. If your poultry are lethargic or display signs of illness or mites, those animals should be left at home to prevent the spread of disease to other birds at the show. Following essential biosecurity can significantly reduce the risk of infecting your flock and the flocks of others. Your birds may be denied entry if there is evidence of illness or mite infestation.

- Please review your birds and ensure your flock is healthy and free from disease or infestations.
- Clean and disinfect all carriers or boxes used for transporting birds before departing for the show and adding fresh bedding.

#### At the show

- The exhibitor should maintain the health and cleanliness of their birds, and any suspected violations should be reported to the show secretary or the show superintendent for further inspection.
- Only exhibitors and judges should handle poultry.
- Sales cages will only managed by registered sales vendors.

# Dwight Madsen, MO

# 2024 GCSPF Show Judges

# Donald Barger, CA

Donald lives in Prunedale, CA. He has bred and raised various poultry breeds and currently breeds Old English Game Bantams, Modern Game Bantams, Serama Bantams, Langhan Bantams, and Large Phoenix. He started breeding and raising chickens in his teens and started with Large Game fowl. His 1st bantams were a trio of Buff Cochins purchased from a local hatchery. His favorite aspect of showing poultry is all of the great friends he has met involved in this hobby. Donald has been the Poultry Chairman for the Monterey County Fair for 35+ years and is currently the Poultry Chairman for the San Benito County Fair. He has been a 4-H leader for 35+ years, including Poultry, Rabbit, and Swine, and is currently the Poultry and Rabbit project leader for Royal Oaks 4-H. Donald is a Western Fairs Association Blue Ribbon Award recipient and a lifetime member of the APA and ABA. He has been an APA and ABA generalized licensed judge since 2007. When Donald started showing, he also began to clerk at as many shows as possible. At that time, Walt Leonard encouraged him to get his judging license and would not let up until he did. Donald has been the current Chairman and member of the APA Standard Revision Committee for 10+ years and has hosted the Gold Coast Poultry Fanciers show in January, located in Hollister, CA, for 15 years. A fun fact about Donald is that he goes to the gym 5 days a week, has done fitness modeling, and plans to compete in bodybuilding competitions.









# Eric Kutch, CA

Eric was born in Northwest New Jersey in Suffolk County but currently resides in Jamestown, CA. Eric started breeding and showing birds in 1958 when he was 10-12 years old. At this time, Eric's great-grandmother showed and bred New Hampshire reds in New York City, and his neighbors showed at the Madison Square Garden; Eric got interested in showing and entering his own birds for show. One of Eric's mentors was Harvey Woods. Harvey was one of the greatest breeders of large fowl Brahmas. A 1947 postage stamp was created displaying his Brahma chicken. 4-H was not a thing when Eric started breeding Millie D'Uccle's, but he was a secretary for the Morris County Poultry Association in New York. Eric got to a point in breeding poultry and showing where he wanted the next level of experience, so he started judging and has been a judge for the last 24 years. Eric is a licensed ABA and APA judge and a master breeder in both groups. Eric's favorite aspect

of poultry is the breeding process.


