
Our show will have a District ABA meet and there will be cash awards for the winners of the Junior Show and Showmanship competition.

We look forward to seeing you all and make sure to say hello to me as I am running around.



The Youth Poultry Program will be in the **Gem and Mineral Building**, which is a separate building from the Open and Junior Show Exhibition.

Showmanship: Pre-Registration required with your entry for the Junior Poultry Show. **Sign-in** required (7:30—8:15 A.M) Saturday on day of show at the Youth Program building. No late sign-ins past 8:15AM on Saturday morning.

Showmanship will begin at 8:30 A.M. For Mini, Novice, Intermediate, Juniors and Seniors. Showmanship birds should not be entered in the show.

Showmanship: This event is open to youth in all age/experience divisions. Minis and Juniors will compete first, followed by Intermediate and Seniors.

We ask everyone to be silent during showmanship.

Registration should be done ahead of time with your entry in the Junior Poultry Show. There will be no registration on site for showmanship.

Birds used in showmanship must be owned by the competitor, and may NOT be entered in the show. A fee of \$5.00 will be charged to help cover cost of the event. Payment can be made with your entry fee in the Junior Poultry Show using the exhibitor entry form.

Age/Experience Divisions:

Novice - Have never, ever competed in Poultry Showmanship.

Minis - 7 and 8 years of age as of January 1, 2023.

Junior - 9 -11 years of age as of January 1, 2023.

Intermediate - 12 -13 years of age as of January 1, 2023.

Senior - 14 - 18 years of age as of January 1, 2023.

Awards: Ribbons will be presented to 1st through 10th places in each division. Additional awards donated by GCSPF Members

Judging Standard: Free copy of the 4-H Poultry Showmanship - National Standard For anyone who has yet to obtain a copy of the "How to do poultry showmanship the proper way," also known as Publication 4-H 2060E, you need to visit: http://anrcatalog.ucanr.edu/ and click on "4-H Youth Development," next click on "4-H Raising Animals," and you will see the Poultry Showmanship Manual. Download it today. You cannot correctly prepare and compete in Poultry Showmanship without studying this manual.

Dress: 4-H or FFA uniforms are not required, but competitors will be scored on neatness.

Sign-in by 12:00 PM Registered Avian Bowl Teams; Senior teams take written test. Competition begins at 12:30.

Avian Bowl: This event will be conducted by Dr. Francine Bradley of U.C. Davis Extension, and requires advance registration. This event serves as the California State qualifier for 4-H. The winning senior team will be eligible to represent California at the 4-H National Poultry and Egg Conference in Kentucky in November, 2023 Avian Bowl will begin shortly after the conclusion of the Showmanship contests. Time updates will be posted during the day. Advance registration by mail or fax is required with Dr. Bradley.

Nature of the Contest: This teams-only contest covers a broad spectrum of knowledge of avian science and poultry industry categories as diverse as avian anatomy and commercial egg production practices.

Teams: Teams consist of 2, 3 or 4 members. Team members must all be in the same age division, but they need not be from the same club or county.

Junior Teams - all members are 13 years old or younger as of January 1, 2023. Senior Teams - all members are 14 years old or older as of January 1, 2023. Awards: Awards will be presented to the 1st through 3rd place teams in each division.

Judging Standard and Study Materials: National 4-H Avian Bowl Manual is available from the Clemson University Bulletin Room. Please visit https://avian.ucdavis.edu/news/2022-11-30-start-studying-2023-avian-bowl-qualifier for information on ordering the manual.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Entries Close February 13, 2023 (postmarked)

No email entries will be accepted.

If you wish to receive an acknowledgement of entry, please request in your entry form and include an e-mail address.

- 2. Entry Fee \$5.00 Single \$10.00 Double Coop Entry Fees must accompany entry. A \$6.00 clean up fee will be charged each exhibitor.
- 3. Leg Bands Are recommended as a security precaution. Please band your entries and list the band numbers on the entry form. Check your coop cards.
- **4.** Birds must be cooped in before judging begins.
- **5. Disease** Any bird showing evidence of parasites or disease will be removed from the show.
- **6. Feed and Water** Feed will be provided, however exhibitors are responsible for the care of their own animals.
- **7. Handling of Exhibits** No one other than judges or show officials shall be permitted to handle exhibits without the owner's permission.
- **8. Judging-** Judging will be based on the latest edition of the APA and ABA "Standard of Perfection"
- **9. Premiums** All premiums and awards from specialty clubs and individuals are accepted in good faith,. However GCSPF will not be responsible for payment of awards if not received.
- **10. Vendors** Space is limited and is available only for poultry related items. Vendors will have to submit a request on one of our Vendor forms. Vendors will be approved based on demand and available room. There will be a \$25 fee for an 8'X 8' area. This includes 1 table and 2 chairs. If you require an additional table there will be an additional \$25 fee.
- 11. Clerks Anyone wishing to clerk please let the show secretary know when you check in.
- **12. Championship Row** Only entries that have been judged as Champion or Reserve Champion of class may be cooped on championship row. Please help our show superintendent by placing your birds in Champion Show row as directed by the show superintendent.
- **13. Awards and Trophies:** After champions are selected. Please don't ask for your awards prior to judging of Championship Row.
- **14. Conduct** APA Code of Conduct will be enforced. Failure to comply will result in disqualification of entry and removal from grounds.
- **15. Locks** Any birds in cages that are locked by exhibitors will not be judged. Cages may be locked after judging is completed.
- 16. No vehicles in building at any time.
- 17. Coop Out—Coop out will be conducted after all birds are judged. There will be *no early coop outs*.



If you are selling birds in the sale area you are responsible for the security of your own birds. Nylon zip ties will be available to secure your cages from the Sale Area Table. Any bird showing evidence of parasites or disease will be removed from the sale area.

APA National Egg Show

The GCSPF will be hosting an egg show. Send in your egg show entry form to compete in this fun and exciting egg show. Our egg show judge and clerk will be John and Ruth Johnstone.

Main Egg Competition (only an entry in this division may qualify for Egg Show Champion)

One entry consists of a group of 3 eggs.

Open and Junior in each division.

Judging Criteria: Shell color (when breed standard has stated color, varation from this is penalized), Shape, Texture, Uniformity.

Entries shall note the breed of eggs, non standard (not recognized by APA), mix or unknown ancestry.

Divisions

Large Eggs – Breed, Non-Standard or mix noted on entry card. Classes: White, Brown, or other colors (speckled or mottled entered by background color).

Bantam Eggs – Breed or Non-Standard noted on entry card. Classes: White, Brown, or other colors (speckled or mottled entered by background color).

Waterfowl eggs – Breed or Non-Standard noted on entry card. Classes: White, brown, or other colors (speckled or mottled entered by background color).

All Other Eggs – Emu, Turkey, etc. Classes: White, brown, or other colors (speckled or mottled entered by background color).

Painted Egg Competition

1 egg consists of one entry. Multiple entries accepted.

Open and Junior (please note age category: 5-7yrs, 8-11 yrs, 12-16 yrs.). Egg must be hard boiled or blown.

Egg is painted or inked. NO adornment or decorations added.

Some type of upright support recommended.

Egg must be painted/inked by exhibitor.

Decorated Egg Completion

1 egg consists of one entry. Multiple entries accepted.

Open and Junior (please note age category: 5-7yrs, 8-11 yrs, 12-16 yrs.). Egg must be hard boiled or blown.

Egg is to be adorned or decorated, but may have paint added.

Outline of egg must be recognizable.

Egg decoration must be created by the exhibitor.

APA Egg Competition Judging Criteria

Shell Color: 6 point possible. Does shell color conform to APA breed standard? This is not applicable of eggs from mix ancestry.

Shape: 3 points possible. Are they too elongated, too small, too rounded?

Texture: 2 points possible.

Matt – 0 points

Satin – 1 point (Shell should feel smooth to the touch all over).

Bright – 2 points (Bloom and appearance will only be present

with freshness).

Uniformity: 3 points possible. How closely do eggs match each other?

Total possible points – 14

In case of ties, judging becomes more detailed.
