DoD TBI Definition

A traumatically induced structural injury or physiological disruption of brain function as a result of external force that is indicated by new onset or worsening of at least one of the following clinical signs immediately following the event:

- Any alteration in mental status (e.g., confusion, disorientation, slowed thinking, etc.) •
- . Any loss of memory for events immediately before or after the injury
- . Any period of loss of or a decreased level of consciousness, observed or self-reported

External forces may include any of the following events: the head being struck by an object, the head striking an object, the brain undergoing an acceleration/deceleration movement without direct external trauma to the head or forces generated from events such as a blast or explosion, including penetrating injuries. (Department of Defense, 2015)



1. Primary symptom code: Code for the presenting complaint (e.g., R41.844 for frontal lobe and executive

2. TBI diagnosis code: S06. E L S E** (Use A for initial visit, D for subsequent visit, or S for sequela)

4. TBI external cause of morbidity code: (e.g., V40-V49 for motor vehicle accidents. Y36 for war operations, Y37 for military operations. Use A for the initial visit. For example, Y36.290A for war

operations involving other explosions and fragments, military personnel, initial encounter)

3. Deployment code, if applicable:*** (e.g., Z56.82 for deployed personnel)

5. Other symptom codes, if applicable: (e.g., R41.1 for anterograde amnesia)

6. Personal history of TBI: (e.g., Z87.820- personal history)
