Requirements

Riders should:

- ★ Walk, trot, & canter confidently
- ★ Be in grade 4 through 12 (starting September 2024)*
- Attend weekly or bi-weekly 2 hour team practice* (Tuesday, Thursday, Friday or Saturday and possibly Sunday depending on rider's level)
- ★ Maintain a weekly standing lesson with their trainer
- ★ Plan to compete in five IEA shows between September and February (and possibly Regionals & Zone Finals in February/March 2025, and Nationals in April 2025)

Costs

- ★ Annual IEA Membership: \$70 for Youth / \$60 for Adult (to be paid to the IEA directly)
- ★ Annual Team Membership: \$100* (to be paid to BEC as soon as rider is confirmed on the team)
- ★ Seasonal IEA Team Package: \$900 for 10 practices*

What is the IEA?



The Interscholastic Equestrian Association is a non-profit organization whose mission is to introduce students (grades 4-12) and now Adults to equestrian sports and to promote and improve the quality of equestrian competition and instruction.

No rider needs to own a horse to compete. Riders in grades 4-8 are eligible for the Middle School team while riders in grades 9-12 compete on the High School team.



Teams take turns hosting horse shows

throughout the season. BEC hosts 3 to 4 IEA shows during the season.



Students ride horses that are provided by the host barn and chosen by a random draw. This equalizes competition variables and tests the horsemanship of the contestants.

Riders should plan to participate in 5 shows to

try to earn enough points to qualify for post-season shows, ie regional, zone and national finals. Teams can also earn points and qualify.

What to expect during the season

- Riders are expected to participate in a weekly or bi weekly team practice in proper attire, including collared shirt, and hair net.
- Team practice will include group riding and non-riding horsemanship and showing strategy components.

What to expect on show day

- Shows are usually on Sundays and about 1 to 2 hours away from BEC. Transportation is not provided. Carpooling is encouraged as the days can be long.
- \star Horses are randomly selected and riders have a short time to familiarize themselves with their mount.
- Riders compete in one or two classes (flat and over fences) depending on their level.
- Riders should plan to be there all day to help and support their teammates.
