Executive Board Meeting

The Alpha Phi Sigma Executive Board meeting was held virtually on September 25-26, 2020.

The Board had a tough decision to make regarding the 2021 annual conference in Orlando, Florida. As Covid-19 case appeared to decrease in the late summer months, healthcare officials stated that there would be a surge in cases for the holidays. The APS Executive Board decided to cancel the in-person conference and ACJS soon followed with their decision to also cancel their in-person conference.

The decision led the board to discuss plans for a virtual conference. The details are still preliminary but the virtual conference will be held on Friday, April 16 and Saturday, April 17, 2020. The two-day conference will feature guest speakers on Cyber Crime and our Scholarships and Awards Ceremony. Other events such as the College Bowl and Crime Scene Investigation are being considered, as well as other activities that members will enjoy.

ATTENTION ADVISORS & STUDENT MEMBERS Membership Processing & Honor Regalia Orders

During COVID-19

NOVEMBER 2020—Due to the uncertainty of colleges and universities once again closing their campuses or using remote learning for the semester, Alpha Phi Sigma will continue to work with each chapter advisor to determine the best course of action for fulfilling membership applications and honor regalia orders this coming fall.

Alpha Phi Sigma remains committed to customer service. We will make sure students continue to receive their membership packets and honor regalia orders in a timely fashion.

For those advisors who will be working remotely, **we will continue to receive applications and orders via email.** We will invoice the student directly and ship to their home, if necessary, but students will have to pay the additional shipping and handling fee. For advisors at schools that are open, we will continue the standard method of shipping to the advisor at the school. Knowing that things may change at any time, we ask that you keep Headquarters informed of closings and shipping alternatives.

The current application for “online students” stipulates that we will ship directly to the member for a \$10 shipping and handling fee. We will use the same method for students who will not attend campus due to closures. Although we wish we could ship for free, APS is one of many non-profit organizations being financially impacted by the pandemic with furloughs and loss of revenue. We count on membership and regalia orders for sustainability through the steadfast support of each and every advisor and member.

Honor Regalia orders will also be received via email from the advisor. We will invoice the member and ship directly to their home. Each student must complete an order form and include S&H listed on the form.

For students completing an application and ordering Honor Regalia at the same time, we will waive the S&H for the regalia. The shipping charge for the membership materials and regalia (regardless of pieces ordered) will remain at \$10.

Induction ceremonies, chapter meetings, and even community service projects are being conducted via zoom by many of our chapters. If your chapter has had success with one or more zoom meetings, please share the details with us so that we can share them with all our chapters.

Scholarships, Awards, and Grants will be accepted until the January 2021 deadline.

We are here to help you in any way we can and hope that we will continue to sustain our organization post this pandemic and for the next 80 years.

Chapters found new innovative ways to have meetings and communicate, even have induction ceremonies on Zoom or Microsoft Teams for new members. Chapters also found ways to adapt service projects to the “new” normal.

Community Service, one of Alpha Phi Sigma’s ideals may seem to be restricted in these unprecedented times, but when you think about how much the community is suffering, now more than ever, we need to show solidarity for students who are struggling, the less fortunate, the sick, the front-line workers, the doctors, nurses, hospital employees, rescue workers, and those who put themselves in danger every day to keep the rest of the community safe. U.S. Marine PVT Howard Miller came home after 77 years KIA during WWII

Golden Alumni Bill Nay had the Honor of participating in the Escort of PVT Howard Miller, USMC. PVT Miller was Killed in Action on November 22, 1943 on the island of Betio in the Tarawa Atoll. His remains were not recovered until September 2019 and sent to the DPAA Laboratory in Hawaii for identification. Bill Nay stated "We were Honored to meet his sister and other family members and we met the flight from Hawaii and escorted them to Skyline Memorial Park." The San Mateo Police Motorcycle unit assisted with the Escort. Motor Officer Jason was presented with an Alpha Phi Sigma Coin.

Volunteer Spotlight ~ Bill and Karen Nay



“Father Nayture” & “Mother Nayture”



Bill and Karen met in 1970 when he was stationed at Marine Corp Base Camp Pendleton. Bill had just returned from a tour of duty in Quang Tri, Vietnam. Karen’s father Raymond Latocki also served in the USMC in WW II, Korea and Vietnam. They were married in 1971 and will celebrate 50 years of marriage next year. Bill spent a career in Law Enforcement and National Security and Karen spent a career as a Registered Nurse.

In the 90’s Bill was assigned to a National Environmental Task Force created by Vice President Gore. He worked with 50 of the most prestigious scientist in America to assist them in getting access to environmental data in the federal government’s archives. The goal was to identify data bases that could shed light on the emerging issues of a global warming and climate change. Bill and Karen began teaching the Nature Merit badge to scouts at summer camp. On a hike in 1995 a young Scout called Karen “Mother NAYture”, with the accent on NAY because of our last name. The rest of the scouts chimed in and I became Father Nayture because I was married to Mother Nayture. The name stuck and we are still called Mother and Father Nayture.



When Bill and Karen retired they moved to Petaluma. They both started volunteer work with the Sonoma County Wildlife Rescue. In 2012 Bill aka “Father Nayture” was asked to conduct a seminar on the wildlife of Sonoma County as part of the Stewards lecture series. Karen came along as usual to assist in the presentation. We fell in love with the majesty of the Armstrong Redwoods and signed up as volunteers to lead hikes in the Redwoods.

Why did you choose Stewards of the Coast and Redwoods to volunteer?

Initially, we began to volunteer in the Redwoods because it was so beautiful and a great excuse to go for a walk in the woods. We quickly learned about the diversity of the outdoor experiences with the Stewards and began to attend the trainings and various seminars. We expanded our volunteer efforts from “The Forest to the Sea” as we started to assist with the Watershed Education Program, the Environmental Living Program and the Tidepool Education Program. Frequently, many of the local schools requested that “Father Nayture” come to the classroom when they could not take a field trip to one of the State Park locations.

What areas of interest are you concentrating on now?

The past couple of years most of our time has been supporting the Tidepool Education program. Most recently, Karen has spent many hours making facemasks to donate to the Stewards.

What improvements would you like to see at Armstrong Woods, and how would you go about improving the experience?

There needs to be more awareness of “Outdoor Ethics”. There are existing national programs that include “Tread Lightly” and “Leave No Trace”. We need to ensure that all our volunteers and staff are practicing the principles outlined in these programs and to include them in all of our presentations. By setting the example and making the principles visible to the public we will be able to help educate everyone to respect and take care of the planet, which is what it means to be a “Steward”.
