




Chapter Advocacy Grants \$250

There are many organizations that work within or with the Criminal Justice System to help individuals.

When a Chapter engages with an organization in their community that provides a service or services within the Criminal Justice System helping adults or juveniles, Alpha Phi Sigma will donate \$250 to the organization.

GUIDELINES

1. Locate an agency in your area that provides a service within the Criminal Justice System: Adult or Juvenile.
2. The Chapter must engage in an activity with the agency.
3. Send Headquarters a brief write-up about the organization, full name and address of the organization, name of a contact person, and a photograph of Chapter members engaging in an activity with the organization.
4. Submit all of the above by email to Headquarters@alphaphisigma.org. Please type **ADVOCACY GRANT** in the subject line.
5. Once the information is approved, the Chapter Advisor will receive from Headquarters an Alpha Phi Sigma check for \$250 payable to the Advocacy Organization.
6. Alpha Phi Sigma members must return to the organization and present the check on behalf of Alpha Phi Sigma through their Chapter.
7. The original story and photographs of the activity along with the photograph of the funds presentation submitted to Headquarters will be featured in the Docket.
9. Only one check per Chapter will be issued per calendar year. Chapters petitioning for a second advocacy grant the following year must choose a different advocacy group from the previous year.


West Chester University of Pennsylvania

On Friday October 7th, some executive board members from the Gamma Rho Chapter delivered 20 travel bags to the organization Get On The Bus.

Get On The Bus is a nonprofit organization that strives to reconnect children with their incarcerated parents. Through this mission, they raise awareness of the barriers families face when connecting with loved ones in prison while advocating for the families' rights to maintain their relationships with incarcerated loved ones.

Get On The Bus provides free bus trips for children and their caregivers to 14 of California's prisons throughout the year. On this bus trip, children and caregivers are provided with travel bags, a photo of their parents, a teddy bear, and meals throughout the day. A special lunch with their incarcerated parent takes place at the prison. These services are provided at no cost to the children's family.

A subcommittee of 8 members of the Gamma Rho Chapter collaborated to raise funds and assemble 20 travel bags for youth to take with them on the bus ride. Each travel bag consisted of travel games, a journal, coloring and activity books, crayons, color pencils, a journal and a card for the child to make for their parent in the institution. Amidst the Covid-19 pandemic, Get On The Bus paused their prison visits due to safety concerns. During this time, members of the Gamma Rho Chapter assisted in assembling stay connected kits for youth to send letters to their parent in prison. The Gamma Rho Chapter is committed to helping Get On The Bus as they resume their in-person prison visits.

Alumni Around the World

University of Nebraska at Kearney

Iota Xi Chapter



Jason Baker, an Alpha Phi Sigma member and Mother Board member from the University of Nebraska at Kearney, majored in Family Science and minored in Criminal Justice. During his time as an undergrad, he was the alumni chair for the Xi Phi chapter from 2020-2021 and he participated in undergrad research for two years studying veteran's experiences transitioning from the military to higher education. Jason is a former U.S. Army Sergeant who served from 2006-2014, and he was also the president of the University of Nebraska at Kearney's Student Veterans Organization. He is pursuing a master's degree in Higher Education Student Affairs at the University of Nebraska at Kearney and is the 2022-2023 Washington State + Zelma Patchin-Oklahoma State Fellow.

Jason shares, "In the future, I want to work with adult learners, those typically over the age of twenty-five who have few resources on college campuses that are designed to meet their needs to be successful in higher education. By helping students to cope with the anxiety and stress that many adult learners face returning to school after often a long absence, I believe will help them be successful in higher education."

APS Military Veterans News



The Changing Demographics of Veterans

The number of Veterans dropped by about 1/3 from 2000 to 2018. Much of this drop is the normal longevity of the World War 2 Veterans. In 2000 there were 5.7 million World War 2 Veterans; but, by 2018 there were fewer than 500,000. In 2018 the largest group were Vietnam Era Veterans with a total of around 6.4 million.

Some of the interesting facts from the 2020 census is that Veterans from recent service periods have a higher education, with more than one-third of Gulf War veterans had a college degree. Unfortunately, Post-911 veterans had a 43% chance of having a service-connected disability. Women make up a growing share of Veterans. About 1.7 million, or 9% of veterans. It is projected that number will jump to 17% by 2040. (Excerpts from: <https://www.census.gov/newsroom/press-releases/2020/veterans-report.html>)



Depending on what survey you look at, Veterans, including those currently serving, account for less than 8% of the population.

Veteran Suicide - (between 16 and 22 a day depending on what survey you read)

Here is a startling finding from: [2022 National Veteran Suicide Prevention Annual Report, VA Suicide Prevention, Office of Mental Health and Suicide Prevention, September 2022](#)

“In 2020, adjusting for population age and sex differences, the suicide rate for Veterans was 57.3% greater than for non-Veteran U.S. adults.”

Homeless – 12% of the Nation’s Homeless are Veterans

I am part of this “cohort” and may have ended up Homeless and possibly opted for Suicide; however, I decided to go back to school. As some of you know, I received my BS and MS at San Jose State University, with Highest Honors. I was the President of Iota Chapter in the 80’s. What many do not know is that it was not easy. I received scholarships and Veteran’s Administration (VA) assistance. I am rated at 70% disabled due to exposure to Agent Orange, PTSD and hearing loss. I am thankful for those members of Alpha Phi Sigma that have been patient with me and have been there when I



needed them. I encourage you to find out who your Veterans are and help them. If they do not have the “grades” help them anyway and maybe, you can make a difference in their lives.



You will find that Veterans are “long term” friends, probably closer than family. I recently went to Honor a Marine I met at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton. He too was a Vietnam Veteran who suffered from exposure to Agent Orange. His exposure led to cancer that took him just when he was looking forward to spending time with his Grandkids. GYSGT “Chris” Christianson was the Marine Criminal Investigator that mentored me and “showed me the ropes”. We were friends for over 50 years. My wife Karen and I are the God Parents to his twin daughters. Yes, Veterans may be gruff sometimes. They may seem to be antisocial and difficult to get to know. Reach out to them and help to reduce homelessness and suicide.

Our Dedicated Golden Alumni

Golden Alumni Andrea Joseph, J.D.

Co-Advisor of the Alpha Chi Alpha Chapter at New Mexico State University, Las Cruces Chapter

Having founded Four Paws and a Wake Up, a non-profit service dog training facility that provides service dogs to veterans with PTSD, mobility limitations, and/or traumatic brain injuries, Golden Alumni Andrea Joseph is spreading the word to veteran organizations in the greater Las Cruces, New Mexico area. Service dogs are donated at no charge to the veteran and after 12 – 24 months of training know over 90 commands and are able to complete tasks such as:

- Retrieving dropped/distant objects
- Pulling wheelchairs
- Opening doors and turning on lights
- Providing physical support for mobility
- Creating space in a crowd
- Loading a washer, unloading a dryer
- Gently waking a veteran having a nightmare or returning to the present if having a flashback


