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

Mirror Image Arts

Join Mirror Image Arts in transforming youth interventions through Restorative Theatre, a unique approach combining somatic play, storytelling, and restorative practices. This interactive session will explore how evidence-based methods and theatre techniques can disrupt the pipeline to prison and empower youth to reclaim their narratives. Participants will engage in dynamic activities and learn how to adapt these tools to foster healing, resilience, and systemic change in their own communities. Rooted in public health frameworks, this program highlights Prevention, Intervention, and Reintegration strategies for collective liberation and lasting impact.



Kiana English
Program Coordinator for Restorative Theatre

Kiana English is an Actor, Teaching Artist, and Writer. When she graduated from American Musical Dramatic Academy with her BFA in Theatre, she knew she wanted to use her degree to help communities that didn't have access to art. She started creating organi-

zations (Culture of Survivors), proposals (toxic masculinity and bodies of cultures), and other individual artist projects that served at-risk communities. She went on to be a teaching artist in Philadelphia for two years for at-risk youth before coming to Mirror Image Arts to continue her work. Kiana has specialized in utilizing Restorative Theatre with system impacted youth for the past four years.



Maya Osterman Executive Director of Programs

Maya began her work as an applied theatre practitioner over a decade ago. Upon receiving her BFA in Theatre Performance from the University of Colorado (with a focus on applied theatre), Maya was the Assistant Director for the Interactive Theatre Project housed on the University of Colorado - Boulder campus.

She then created the ACTivism Theatre Ensemble, a company of high school and college students performing an educational outreach/prevention play for The SAVA (Sexual Assault Victim Advocacy) Center throughout Colorado. While living in North Carolina she wrote plays for the Interactive Theatre Carolina at the University of North Carolina - Chapel Hill exploring race and identity. At that time she also founded Restorative Theatre which is now in the process of being trademarked as the pedagogy and praxis of MIA. Maya has facilitated programming in youth detention centers for 10 years. Maya has taught theatre and dance as an elementary school teacher and has worked as a Para for Special Education in K-8 schools. Maya joined Mirror Image Arts in July 2014.



Chris Wolfe

Chris helps life-sentenced men, who are now eligible for parole, transition from institutionalized prison life, back into society, and many of these men were sentenced to life in prison while they were just teenagers. Chris will share their stories with you, so you understand how they ended up in prison. Not one of their parents ever thought their son would end up in prison, unfortunately, they did. We can all learn from these stories to prevent any young person from making the same bad choices and bad decisions these men made, which changed the trajectory of their lives... forever.

In 2007, Chris founded the Voices of Time Toastmasters Club for the Dr. Regina B. Shearn Corrections Transition Program at Everglades Correctional Institution. Not only do the men in this program all become better speakers, listeners, and thinkers, they all gain tremendous confidence and self-esteem, which a sizable per-

centage of the men never had. Chris uses his knowledge of The Power of Public Speaking to illustrate how effective communication is essential for troubled youths.

Chris is a graduate of the University of Florida, where he earned a B.S. in Business Administration and majored in Management. In 2007. He is on the Board of Directors, RBS Corrections Transition Program. Chris is also a member of the National Marijuana Initiative's speaker's bureau, as well as a spokesperson for the organization, which provides information on the negative effects of marijuana usage. For thirty years, Chris has been involved with Toastmasters International and has served as President of the Miracle Mile Toastmasters Club, in Coral Gables, Florida, and competed in numerous public speaking competitions.

Definition of an Alpha Phi Sigma Member

An Alpha Phi Sigma member is a student who has met all the qualifications and is granted membership by Alpha Phi Sigma Headquarters, Membership is effective upon Headquarters mailing membership certificate to the advisor or student.

Provisionary Chapter members ARE NOT Alpha Phi Sigma members. Chapters Shall NOT issue Alpha Phi Sigma certificates to provisionary members. Chapters issuing membership certificates may be subject to closure by Headquarters.

Students MUST meet all the qualifications for membership in order to be Alpha Phi Sigma members. Only by receiving an Alpha Phi Sigma Certificate from Headquarters constitutes membership requirements have been met and student is officially a member.

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

- Chapter representative must be present at the Business Meeting Roll Call to receive ballot.
- Voting will take place on Friday during the Business Meeting.
- Votes will be tabulated and winner announced.
- Installation of elected Executive Officers and Advisors will be held directly after the winners are announced.

Alpha Phi Sigma Executive Student Officers Elections CAMPAIGNING POLICY & GUIDELINES

Welcome to the 2025-2027 Executive (National) Student Officers Elections.

Please read the following guidelines to run a professional and ethical campaign and election.

- All campaigning MUST stop on Friday, March 13, 2025 at noon. Prior to the lunch break, please remove all campaign materials from the tables in the meeting room.
- No posting of flyers, banners, or any materials on the walls, doors, columns, or other areas of the hotel.
- Give-away materials may be handed to members throughout the day on Wednesday, Thursday and only until noon on Friday.
- Remember that it is the Chapter/School running for office, not the individual students. Please make sure you word all materials with the name of the Chapter/School running for office.
- Materials may be placed on the tables in the Alpha Phi Sigma meeting room and on tables at the Alpha Phi Sigma hospitality suite.
- Please do not tape materials to the tables. All materials on tables are to be removed prior to noon on Friday.
- Do not remove other candidate's materials from tables.

Campaign speeches will be timed as follows:

- Presidential Slate: 2 minutes per officer per chapter
- Vice President: 2 minutes per candidate
- Wrap-up speeches on Friday will be limited to 1 (one) minute per candidate (President, VP, Secretary, and Treasurer).

The voting will be conducted as follows:

Headquarters will hand out a ballot to each chapter representative. Chapter must be in good standing.

Headquarters will collect the folded ballots and judges will count the votes. The winners will be announced after the count is complete.

Installation of new officers will be conducted in accordance with Alpha Phi Sigma policy and presented by the Associate Director, Adriana Jansen.

The outgoing officers and incoming officers and their advisor must attend the conference closing meeting following the adjournment of the 2025 conference program. The elected officers and their respective advisor will commence their two-year term on May 1, 2025. Executive officers and advisors must attend the Board meetings in Ft. Lauderdale in the fall and the conferences in the spring during their two-year term.






