

## NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON TAX INCREASE

PROPOSED TAX RATE	\$0.10 per \$100
NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE	\$0.078835 per \$100
VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE	\$0.114207 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2025 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for Atascosa Emergency Services District No. 1 from the same properties in both the 2024 tax year and the 2025 tax year. The voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate that Atascosa Emergency Services District No. 1 may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate. The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that Atascosa Emergency Services District No. 1 is proposing to increase property taxes for the 2025 tax year.

A public hearing on the proposed tax rate will be held on September 16, 2025 at 15078 Main Street, Lytle, TX 78052. The proposed tax rate is not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, Atascosa Emergency Services District No. 1 is not required to hold an election at which voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the Board of Emergency Services Commissioners of Atascosa Emergency Services District No. 1 at their offices or by attending the public hearing mentioned above.

Your taxes owed under any of the tax rates mentioned above can be calculated as follows:  
Property tax amount = tax rate x taxable value of your property / 100

The 86th Texas Legislature modified the manner in which the voter-approval tax rate is calculated to limit the rate of growth of property taxes in the state.
