- Reef-safe sunscreen (SPF 30 or higher) and lip balm with SPF
- After-sun lotion or aloe vera
- Insect repellent

- Feminine hygiene products
- Contact lenses and solution (if applicable)

### 4. Beach & Pool Accessories

- Sunglasses (UV protection)
- Wide-brimmed hat or cap
- Beach tote or day bag
- Reusable water bottle
- Waterproof phone pouch or case
- Lightweight towel or sarong (if preferred over resort-provided options)

### 5. Electronics

- Mobile phone and charger
- Portable power bank
- E-reader, tablet, or a book
- Camera or action camera (e.g., GoPro)
- Travel power adapter (if traveling internationally)

## 6. Optional Enhancements

- Snorkeling gear (if not provided by resort)
- Light snacks or protein bars
- Small travel games or playing cards
- Laundry bag or compression packing cubes
- Reusable straw or utensils (eco-conscious travelers)
