Car Line Reminders

Families: While we are seeing a steady improvement with the flow of car line, we want to provide a few reminders on how to make the process safe and efficient for everyone.

Morning car line families: To help ensure your student is in their seat by 7:40am, please keep in mind that the most congested time for car line is in the last 10 minutes as the high school car line also gets going. Please adjust your arrival time accordingly so that you can also exit the campus smoothly.



Car Line Reminders

Arrival:

- Students should not be let out of your car until 7:10am. This ensures staff is available to monitor them.
- DO NOT EVER let your child out on Lutz Lake Fern Road.
- Have your car seats on the RIGHT side of the backseat.
- Have your student ready to get out of the car: backpack ready, shoes on, etc.
- Parents DO NOT get out of the car; someone will help your child.
- Pull all the way forward as directed by staff.

Dismissal:

- For safety, parents cannot line up before 12pm on Mondays and 1pm on other days.
- Parents DO NOT get out of your car; your child will come to you.
- Have your car tag visible.
- Have car seats on the RIGHT side of the backseat.
- Continue pulling up. Do not stop when you see your student.
- If your child needs help buckling: Pull up before helping them or teach them how to buckle themselves.

DO pull all the way forward in line. This is the only way to ensure there is enough space for students to get out on time.



DON'T ever let your child out on Lutz Lake Fern Road. This is dangerous for everyone.

All students deserve the best educational experience possible.



Students who ride the bus to school, should arrive on-time every day.

When there aren't enough bus drivers, students arrive late.



Students need a high-quality and consistent teacher in their classroom every day.

Currently, 450 classrooms are without a full-time teacher.



Students deserve a positive school culture where they can thrive.

Students are affected when leaders leave their school.

To provide the best educational experience, we need additional funding to retain and recruit high-quality educators and support for our schools.

School districts across the state have faced this same challenge.

To address this, voters in 25 other counties approved a millage referendum to provide the additional funding to pay their teachers and support staff more. Hillsborough County is the only county in the six-county area that does not have an additional millage.





A Promising Solution!

This November, a millage referendum for our schools will be on the ballot. These essential funds will help us retain and recruit high-quality teachers to create the best classroom experience for our students.

What is the cost to property owners?

Property owners would pay \$1 for every \$1,000 in taxable home value.



Example of a typical home in Hillsborough County:

\$281,000 Taxable Value

The investment for a typical homeowner would be \$281 per year, which averages to about 75 cents a day.

What is the benefit for our schools?

A millage would raise an estimated \$177 million to support our students each year

\$150.4 million to district schools \$26.6 million to charter schools based on enrollment - as of 1/23/24

Millage must be renewed every 4 years.

Revenue amounts are projected estimates for fiscal year 2025-2026, when the funds would be available for use.
