Katie Williams is a Canadian Christian Artist, Worship Leader, Songwriter and Volunteer Worship Arts Instructor living in Northern Alberta with her husband and two girls. She comes from a rich heritage of French, Irish and Indigenous decent. She is a First Nation Mi'kmaq from Eel River Bar Reserve in New Brunswick and in recent years has begun to learn and unravel the delicate mysteries of her family lineage so that she can preserve and share these understandings with her girls and generations to come.

Katie's passion for music started at a young age watching her father write and sing with his band. It was in those early years that she started songwriting and falling in love with Jesus. She always had a deep knowing that God was going to use the songs He put in her heart somehow. She released an album in 2012 and shifted into a season of growing her family and serving in her local church. But the persistent nudging to share her songs only grew stronger over the years. So, in faith, she began stepping out into the deep waters, keeping her eyes fixed on Jesus as He started to breathe life into dreams and songs that she had long held close to her heart.

Katie released three singles in 2023 and as a result, she was nominated for four GMA Covenant Awards that included: Indigenous Artist of the Year, Female Vocalist of the year, Adult Contemporary Artist of the Year and was the recipient of Video of the Year (First Love). 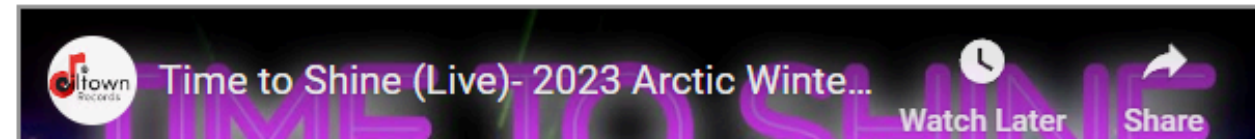

Local Gospel artist nominated for three national awards

A local Gospel music sensation is now up for three national awards.

Katie Williams is nominated for Female Vocalist of the Year, Music Video of the Year, and Worship song of the Year.

The Gospel Music Association of Canada has begun the first round of voting for their annual Covenant Awards celebrating Christian faith-based music.

Williams' recent single First Love has racked up over 13,000 views on YouTube in four months. She followed that success with a new single, Pour Out, released on August 4th.

With numerous artists also in the running, Williams says she won't know if she makes the top five for a few more weeks.

The 43rd annual Covenant Awards are being held from November 17th to 19th in Kitchener-Waterloo.
