#### Letter from our Executive Director:

Dear Friends of BGMH,

Every morning whether at devotions with the residents at BGMH or at home, we pray that God blesses you, all our friends of BGMH. I hope our prayers have helped bring you peace and comfort during life's challenges and that you are healthy and happy as you take a moment to check in on us at BGMH.

In the past few months, we have had many mothers come and go through our doors. It is an everturning, revolving door of women and babies. At our dinner you hear from the women that are welcomed to BGMH experiencing some of the most unimaginable neglect, exploitation, and abuse. As a peer led program, those women include our staff. They arrive expecting to receive items of necessity like clothing, food and shelter, but many find out there is so much more that they receive that is intangible, like kindness, compassion, friendship, and love. Each time a new resident comes in, there is an adjustment that takes place in the home, and once we've gotten to know each other and understand each other's idiosyncrasies someone leaves, or another person arrives. At BGMH we are always in flux, but as many of you know people and children need consistency in order to thrive. That consistency comes from the staff of BGMH in both time and a calm reassuring temperament.

This time of year, I always seem to reflect on my time at BGMH because my anniversary is approaching. When I started, I was told that the average length of time a person does this kind of work (social care work) is about five years. Sharrie and I were just talking about when I began at BGMH my three children were in high school, middle school, and elementary school. A director and mother with school aged children was new to BGMH and we (the board, my staff, my husband, my kids and myself) all knew that it would be challenging and were understandably uncertain of the sustainability due to the taxing nature of the work and demands of a young family. Today, I have a college student, a recent high school graduate, and a high school student. I have two adult children and one that's only two and a half years from his 18th birthday and many of you have seen them grow up as well because they are always selling tickets at our annual dinner. As expected, it has been extremely difficult trying to meet the expectations of our supporters and needs of my children, my staff, the board, as well as our residents. But because of the understanding, compassion, and support given to me by that same list of people, I am about to celebrate my sixth year at BGMH. It is this same understanding, support, and compassion that has been shared with my staff that keeps them here and able to hold the door open at BGMH for eight, eleven, and 25+ years; and share with our residents what was given to them.

This longevity of staff, their consistency, in combination with residents' willingness to receive and use what is being offered to their advantage, that form beautiful transformative stories. Those stories are a testimony to what a special place Bishop Gallegos Maternity Home truly is, and those transformations wouldn't happen without you.

All the residents' stories that are published in our newsletters are in their own words. I hope you enjoy this edition's former resident update from Star; she sounds remarkable! She left just before I arrived at BGMH. May God bless you and your loved ones.

## Former Resident Update: Star

October 2017, I sat on a cold curb with nowhere to go. I was six months pregnant, fresh out of rehab, and feeling lost and scared. I had lost everything, including my daughter. And, although I had successfully completed four months of residential treatment, I was still very much at the beginning of my journey to fix the mess I had made of my life. I called my drug counselor crying. Where do I go from here? That night I was introduced to Caitlin and Bishop Gallegos Maternity Home. BGMH accepted me with such kindness. The women who worked there made me feel like they wanted me there, and they made me feel safe. At a time in my life when I was completely lost, they helped me find a way. They gave me protection and most importantly they gave me time. Time to heal. Time to make a plan. Time to take action. I spent eight months at BGMH. During that time, I completed drug court, outpatient services, codependency classes, domestic violence counseling, anger management counseling, and parenting education. I gave birth to a healthy baby boy in January 2018. Because of BGMH, I had a safe place for him. They also provided everything I needed for my baby so I can focus on being healthy for my son. I started the reunification process for my daughters. Bishop Gallegos gave me a safe place to spend time with my daughters on the weekends, and eventually, allowed them to come live at the house, finalizing reunification. And in June 2018, I walked out of BGMH with my three babies, happier than I had been in years, finally starting to find myself again and so deeply grateful to the program, and the changes they made in me, and to my life.

Over the last six years there has not been a day that goes by that I don't live my life with gratitude. I have never forgotten the broken down, abused, and defeated version of myself. And I have certainly not forgotten the ones that have helped build me back up. Through gratitude and consistency, I have gotten to where I am today. I still have struggles and disappointments, but I never stop pushing forward. I started on the streets sleeping in elevators to stay warm, then to a residential rehabilitation center, to Bishop Gallegos Maternity Home, to my parents' home, to a trailer, to a 2-bedroom apartment, to a 4-bedroom apartment, and this week I have been packing to move to our new house that I will own, with the help of the Habitat for Humanity program.

The small acts that we do, day in and day out, add up to make a big impact on our growth. Sometimes we get caught up in what we have now, in this moment, instead of focusing on planting seeds for our future. Be courageous, be patient, be vigilant. Remember that the last thing to grow on a fruit tree is the fruit.

Thank you to BGMH for giving me the seeds to plant and giving me the courage to be someone different.
