
MISSION: Encouraging the development and preservation of North Beach and working to create a safe and environmentally sound neighborhood


Neighborhood children helped design the playground and helped paint games on the sidewalk. The project built community.



#3 North Beach History Plaza



What was previously a pothole-covered parking lot to the north of Pier 99 Restaurant near the USS Lexington was converted into a new public amenity dedicated to North Beach history.

Bond 2012 Concrete Pedestrian Plaza



With Bond 2012 funding, the city closed off the flooded parking lot and repaved it in concrete, creating a new Pedestrian Plaza.

2022 – History signage added



Then NBCA's History Committee came up with the idea of installing 16 educational history signs in the new concrete pedestrian plaza.

Creating the History Plaza Panels



In 2017, two NBCA members initiated the concept for a history plaza. Over the next 2 years, they volunteered their time to research and design and the 16 outdoor educational panels that now make up the North Beach History Plaza.

Collaborating with History Museum




June 2018 - NBCA's History Committee consulted with senior staff at the Corpus Christi Museum of Science and History to gather historic information for the new plaza dedicated to the history of North Beach.

First Completed Panel




The finished panels measure about 4 feet x 3 feet.




Feb 2018 – NBCA members attended a city planning session to learn that the city had a new plan for North Beach involving a drainage canal and breakwater.


2018 - The Gateway Plan called for a navigable canal and breakwater islands, which was all new to NBCA members.


2021 – The North Beach plan eventually got refined to this version.

The Navigable Canal




2021 – Artist's Rendering of the Navigable Canal. The concept garnered equal levels of interest and skepticism.

The Linear Parkway



2021 – Artist's Rendering of a Linear Parkway (not navigable to large boats). This concept is less costly due to fewer tall roadway bridges being needed.



2022 – Linear Open Space + Open Channel as envisioned by the firm MIG, which the city hired to assess previous all drainage plans and design a path forwards.

The MIG Plan



2022 – MIG's plan for a North Beach drainage solution starts with elevating major roadways (red) and some land (orange), directing storm water to a central open channel connected to the bay.

The MIG Plan

Steps for Solving North Beach Drainage Issues

- Confirm desired level of protection
- Identify long-term revitalization plan and multimodal transportation needs
- Implement short term elevation and conveyance design and phasing
- Develop long term plan for low lying areas
- Implement Sediment Monitoring and Cleaning Program

*All steps include communication with public and stakeholders

Burleson Exit Will Close




The Burleson Ave exit will be permanently closed when the new bridge is complete, so the city is planning on widening and repaving Beach Avenue, which will become North Beach's only northbound exit.

Why Only One Exit




The Harbor Bridge Project will reduce North Beach's northbound exits from 2 to 1, moving all traffic to the north part of the beach near Beach Ave. The reason is that the new bridge will be too high at Burleson Avenue to accommodate an exit there.

Detours Cause Delays



2022 – Many of NBCA's previous concerns have been addressed, as TxDOT improved drainage on both sides of the highway by elevating the frontage roads and storm water culverts underneath the highway. Other concerns were safer pedestrian crossings and controlling the traffic flow onto Beach Ave which are still concerns.

Patience! Progress Underway



Detours from the Harbor Bridge Project are long-term and kind of a hassle, but most people feel it will be worth the wait.


2022 – Lighthouse is almost complete with chapel going up beside it. Other stone buildings are 130-unit apartment complex.
