New Jersey Department of Labor Tuition Assistance On-Demand Jobs available through Career Center Eligible Training Provider List (ETPL) programs

Detailed Information:

1. What is the Eligible Training Provider List (ETPL)?

The ETPL is a comprehensive list of training providers and training programs that the **New Jersey Department of Labor & Workforce Development** has determined eligible to receive publicly funded tuition assistance. The ETPL is mandated by both State and Federal laws. New Jersey State Law (C:34:15C-10.2) states that "[no training provider who is not an approved training provider included on the [ETPL] shall receive any federal job training funds or State job training funds." The ETPL serves as a consumer protection for New Jersey's training seekers. New Jersey's ETPL is made available to NJ residents through the Training Explorer tool.

2. I am currently receiving unemployment, and I saw that there is a tuition assistance program that I may be eligible for as a NJ Real Estate Agent. Can you please tell me what the next steps are?

You need to schedule an appointment at the One Stop Career Center of your County and mention that you are interested in taking the Real Estate Salesperson or Broker course at Summers Day Real Estate School of NJ. Their representative will evaluate your eligibility and to be eligible for the grant, you need to submit an Acceptance Letter provided by Summers Day Real Estate School of NJ. You have to email us the details provided by them so that we can process your request with an Acceptance Letter.

3. Should I register for the classes now or wait until this process is complete?

After meeting with your Career Navigator at the One-Stop Career Center of your County, you need to submit an Acceptance Letter from Summers Day Real Estate School of NJ. You need to wait till the process is complete.

4. How can I get the Acceptance Letter?

We provide the Acceptance Letter after you send us the details and go to your local NJ One Stop Career Center the first time.
