Terms and Definitions

In our first in a series of articles, we'll list and discuss different dog training terms. Ask your instructor or the Director of Training if you have questions about what is best for you and your dog. One size does not fit all!

Collars are a staple of pet ownership. Some owners use them as fashion choices to glam up their canine friends. Think Reese Witherspoon's Bruiser from Legally Blonde. Flat collar choices are endless, but choosing from various training collars requires thought and some experimentation. Variables to consider are your dog's head and neck size, its energy level and temperament, and your training goals. Here are the most common obedience collar choices.



Flat (buckle) collar



It's a simple strap with a buckle or snap closure, usually made of nylon or leather. It is the most basic and commonly used collar.

Everyday use for identification tags, walking, and light training. Both the flat and Martingale collars can be used in AKC competitions.

Martingale Collar



It tightens slightly when the dog pulls, but by design, it will limit tightening preventing choking. It consists of a main loop and a smaller control loop.

It prevents dogs from slipping out of the collar, which is ideal for dogs with narrow heads like Greyhounds. Used for gentle control.

Choke Chain



Made of metal links, this collar tightens around the dog's neck when the leash is pulled. Used for correction during training only. Ideally, the handler makes small, quick, attention-getting corrections, not prolonged tug-of-war battles, which could damage the dog's trachea.

Remove it when not training.

Prong or Pinch Collar



It has metal prongs that pinch the dog's neck when pulled. The design distributes pressure evenly around the neck. Unlike the choke chain, it has the Martingale design, which limits how tightly the collar will close.

Yes, it looks severe, but ask the DOT for a demonstration and try it out on your own arm. It puts pressure; it does not "poke". It also fits dogs well, especially if they have a large head and small(er) neck.

Head Collar (Halti or Gentle Leader)



Fits around the dog's muzzle and behind the ears, similar to a horse's halter.

It offers control over the dog's head. Do not use it on flat-faced dogs.

E-Collar



Delivers an electric shock to the dog via remote control. Shock intensity can be easily adjusted. Trainers use the least amount of intensity required for training.

Used for behavior correction and off-leash training. The DOT can give you more information.

Training Harness



Worn around the dog's body rather than the neck. Includes various attachment points for better control.

Provides control without putting pressure on the neck. Good for dogs that pull or have respiratory issues.


Obedience Trial Champion is the highest obedience honor a dog can receive. Noah is working towards earning 100 points by placing well in his trials. He's getting very close!

Introducing Fly Ball

You can literally feel the anticipation in the air as the dogs line up and wait for a Flyball relay race to begin. As soon as the gun fires, each dog dashes over a line of low hurdles to reach a box. Once there, they use their paws to push a spring-loaded pad and release a tennis ball into the air that they catch and bring back to their handlers. Once back to the starting line, the next dog takes his turn.

In partnership with the North American Flyball Association (NAFA), AKC recognizes four titles: Flyball Dog Champion (FDCH), Flyball Master (FM), ONYX and Flyball Grand Champion (FGDCH). Owners can request these titles be recognized on their dog's AKC record by completing a simple Title Application.

Flyball got its start in the late 1960's and early 1970's, when a group of dog trainers in Southern California created scent discrimination hurdle racing, then put a guy at the end to throw tennis balls to the dogs when they finished the jump line. It didn't take long for the group to decide to build some sort of tennis ball-launching apparatus, and the first flyball box was born. Herbert Wagner is credited with developing the first flyball box, and apparently he did a flyball demo on the *Tonight Show* with Johnny Carson that got a lot of people's attention. Subsequently, the new dog sport for dog enthusiasts was introduced in the Toronto-Detroit area by several dog training clubs. After a few small tournaments were held in conjunction with dog shows, the first ever flyball tournament was held in 1983.

Fun



Teach your dog to crawl

Start with a down position: With a treat in hand, slowly slide the treat away from them.

Reward forward movement: Reward your dog with a treat every time they move forward.

Increase expectations: Gradually increase the number of paw movements your dog needs to make before receiving a treat. Once your dog is consistently crawling with a hand signal, you can add a verbal cue like "crawl."

Use treats with different levels of tastiness to keep your dog guessing.

Start small: Start by crawling under something low, like a coffee table or chair.

Use a collar: A collar can help your dog focus.

Be patient: It can take a lot of time and patience to teach your dog to crawl.
