Even a small amount of processed sugar and Halloween candy can be dangerous to your dog. Turkey bones pose similar threats as do other sweet & savory flavors of Thanksgiving. This fall, take caution with what smells good to the dog's nose around the house. Over 10 grams of sweets is considered to be toxic! Thanks to Jean **Eremo** for contributing a list of toxic foods - some of which are more frequently found in our homes this time of year: Onions, Nutmeg, Milk & Dairy Products, Yeast Dough, Sugar Free Gum and Candy, Grapes & Raisins, Pits/Seeds of: Apple, Apricot, Cherry and Plum, & Chocolate (to name a few). Contact your local veterinarian if you suspect a four legged furry friend couldn't keep their "paws" off of the Halloween candy...

October marked the RPDTC Fall VST. A TON of work goes into hosting a tracking test – and it is getting harder to find volunteers.

Tracking can seem intimidating to those with no information or background in the sport – like most dog sports! Additionally, most people will say they don't want to wake up that early! (As a fellow beauty rest advocate, I can understand...)

So, one might understand how difficult it is to find tracklayers and volunteers for a trial when students who are able to lay tracks are often attempting to enter the trial and are no longer eligible to lay track for that trial - while others balk at a 7am start time - Quite a dilemma!

But imagine your last trial or the last award or title you and your dog celebrated in any event. Now, imagine showing up the day of the event and there not being enough volunteers to run it smoothly. Imagine if that event was cancelled due to a lack of volunteer availability! To help advocate for volunteers and ease some of the fears of the unknown we are prepping a few tutorial videos on what to expect at various trials and test as a volunteer which will be posted to youTube! We scoured youTube and much to our surprise there is limited insights for volunteers! We feel that this will help encourage members and guests of the club to volunteer outside of their comfort zone
