

## October 24, 1988 - Studio Notes

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My children, I invite you all to my table; come and eat of the fruits of life. For the fruits, I offer you are everlasting. These will nourish you to the full and will bring light to your eyes. And you will hear the voice of God, and you will know the peace of my son.

My children, let his peace flow throughout your hearts. Do not have any walls of anger or bitterness, for it is of your will to tear down this wall that keeps our Lord from showering his peace on you.

My children, you must not forget your promise to the Lord to pray, to fast, to love, for your families, for your brothers and sisters. You must bring reconciliation into your families. You must love enough to reconcile, to bring peace into your families. You must first reconcile yourselves to God to bring peace to you, thus being able to bring peace where the Lord calls you to.

My children, my children, I see my few faithful. I see the lack of faithfulness among my families. What more can I do but to invite you and to pray for you?

Jesus has heard my prayers and yours, and many have been healed. Many have hope once again. My children, I again invite all of your families to be here with me to bring comfort to my Sorrowful Heart. Comfort me with your love, with your hearts, with your families. Peace of my son, Jesus, go with you to protect your hearts from unfaithfulness.

Thank you for being here tonight. I will send my blessings to you tonight.

My children, do not forget to pray for your shepherds. They need you, and they need your prayers, just as I need your prayers for them. My children do not be so ready to condemn, be ready to forgive, to love, to show mercy.

My children, do not be so involved in your world that you cannot take time to pray, to love. Remember, my children, the Kingdom of God should be your first concern. Meditate on the Scripture of Matthew, where Jesus urges you to seek after God's kingdom first.<sup>1</sup>

My children, I share this peace with you, and I ask that you also share this peace with people whom I send. My children, this is not for you alone, but you must spread it. You must proclaim

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the goodness of my beloved son. So many are searching. So many are seeking worldly things to give them peace and joy. My children, you have found the answer. Now you must live it and share it.

My children, do not let the pressures and material goods of this world hold you fast. You must surrender all. The joys this world gives will fade away. The joys my son will give if you follow his ways will never fade.

My children, you only have to ask my son for his graces to turn from sin and turn to Him. Ask my children, and then strive to follow Him.

## Summary of the Message

This Marian message invites the faithful to come to Christ for spiritual nourishment that leads to eternal life and true peace. Mary calls her children to remove anger and bitterness, reconcile with God and family, and remain faithful through prayer, fasting, and love. She expresses sorrow over the lack of faithfulness in families but encourages hope, reminding them that many prayers have already brought healing. The message urges believers to pray for their shepherds, show mercy instead of condemnation, seek God's Kingdom above worldly concerns, and share the peace of Christ with others. Ultimately, Mary calls her children to surrender worldly attachments and turn away from sin so they may receive the everlasting joy that comes from following her Son.

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## Line-by-Line Breakdown

**“My children, I invite you all to my table; come and eat of the fruits of life.”**

Scripture: John 6:35 — “I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me shall not hunger.”

Explanation: Mary invites the faithful to the Eucharistic life of Christ, where the soul receives the nourishment of grace.

**“For the fruits, I offer you are everlasting.”**

Scripture: John 6:27 — “Do not work for food that perishes, but for the food that endures to eternal life.”

Explanation: The spiritual gifts that come through Christ lead to eternal life rather than temporary satisfaction.

**“These will nourish you to the full and will bring light to your eyes.”**

Scripture: Psalm 19:8 — “The commandment of the Lord is pure, enlightening the eyes.”

Explanation: God's grace and truth illuminate the soul and restore spiritual vision.

**“And you will hear the voice of God, and you will know the peace of my son.”**

Scripture: John 10:27 — “My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me.”

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Explanation: Through prayer and grace, believers recognize Christ's voice and receive His divine peace.

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### **“My children, let his peace flow throughout your hearts.”**

Scripture: John 14:27 — “Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you.”

Explanation: Christ's peace fills the hearts of those who open themselves to His presence.

### **“Do not have any walls of anger or bitterness.”**

Scripture: Ephesians 4:31 — “Let all bitterness and wrath and anger... be put away from you.”

Explanation: Sinful resentment blocks the grace that God desires to pour into the soul.

### **“For it is of your will to tear down this wall that keeps our Lord from showering his peace on you.”**

Scripture: Revelation 3:20 — “Behold, I stand at the door and knock.”

Explanation: God respects human freedom, so the soul must freely open itself to His grace.

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### **“My children, you must not forget your promise to the Lord to pray, to fast, to love.”**

Scripture: Matthew 6:1–18 — Jesus teaches prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

Explanation: These traditional practices of Christian life draw believers closer to God.

### **“For your families, for your brothers and sisters.”**

Scripture: Galatians 6:2 — “Bear one another's burdens.”

Explanation: Christian charity requires caring spiritually and materially for others.

### **“You must bring reconciliation into your families.”**

Scripture: Matthew 5:23–24 — “First be reconciled to your brother.”

Explanation: Unity in families reflects God's desire for reconciliation among His people.

### **“You must love enough to reconcile, to bring peace into your families.”**

Scripture: Colossians 3:13–14 — “Forgive each other... and above all these put on love.”

Explanation: Love rooted in Christ empowers forgiveness and restores relationships.

### **“You must first reconcile yourselves to God to bring peace to you.”**

Scripture: 2 Corinthians 5:20 — “Be reconciled to God.”

Explanation: Peace with others flows from first receiving God's forgiveness.

### **“Thus being able to bring peace where the Lord calls you to.”**

Scripture: Matthew 5:9 — “Blessed are the peacemakers.”

Explanation: Those reconciled with God become instruments of His peace in the world.

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**“My children, my children, I see my few faithful.”**

Scripture: Luke 18:8 — “When the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?”

Explanation: Mary echoes Christ’s concern about the perseverance of faith in difficult times.

**“I see the lack of faithfulness among my families.”**

Scripture: Joshua 24:15 — “As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.”

Explanation: The family is called to be a domestic church rooted in fidelity to God.

**“What more can I do but to invite you and to pray for you?”**

Scripture: John 2:5 — “Do whatever he tells you.”

Explanation: Like at Cana, Mary intercedes and directs souls toward obedience to Christ.

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**“Jesus has heard my prayers and yours, and many have been healed.”**

Scripture: James 5:16 — “The prayer of a righteous person has great power.”

Explanation: Intercessory prayer, especially through Mary’s maternal role, brings God’s healing grace.

**“Many have hope once again.”**

Scripture: Romans 15:13 — “May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing.”

Explanation: God restores hope in those who trust in Him.

**“I again invite all of your families to be here with me to bring comfort to my Sorrowful Heart.”**

Scripture: Luke 2:35 — “A sword will pierce through your own soul also.”

Explanation: Marian devotion consoles the heart of Mary who suffers for humanity’s sins.

**“Comfort me with your love, with your hearts, with your families.”**

Scripture: John 19:26–27 — Jesus entrusts believers to Mary as her children.

Explanation: Loving devotion from the faithful spiritually consoles the Mother of Christ.

**“Peace of my son, Jesus, go with you to protect your hearts from unfaithfulness.”**

Scripture: Philippians 4:7 — “The peace of God... will guard your hearts and your minds.”

Explanation: Christ’s peace protects believers from spiritual instability and sin.

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**“Thank you for being here tonight. I will send my blessings to you tonight.”**

Scripture: Numbers 6:24–26 — “The Lord bless you and keep you.”

Explanation: Marian blessings reflect God’s maternal care over His people.

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**“My children, do not forget to pray for your shepherds.”**

Scripture: 1 Thessalonians 5:25 — “Brethren, pray for us.”

Explanation: The faithful have a duty to support their spiritual leaders with prayer.

**“They need you, and they need your prayers.”**

Scripture: Hebrews 13:18 — “Pray for us.”

Explanation: Church leaders rely on the prayers of the faithful to fulfill their mission.

**“Do not be so ready to condemn, be ready to forgive, to love, to show mercy.”**

Scripture: Luke 6:36–37 — “Be merciful... judge not, and you will not be judged.”

Explanation: Mercy is central to Christian discipleship.

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**“Do not be so involved in your world that you cannot take time to pray, to love.”**

Scripture: Luke 10:41–42 — “One thing is necessary.”

Explanation: Like Mary of Bethany, believers must prioritize time with God.

**“Remember... the Kingdom of God should be your first concern.”**

Scripture: Matthew 6:33 — “Seek first the kingdom of God.”

Explanation: God must remain the highest priority in Christian life.

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**“I come to share with you the peace of my son, Jesus... a peace the world cannot give.”**

Scripture: John 14:27 — “Not as the world gives do I give to you.”

Explanation: True peace comes only from Christ and not from worldly security.

**“You will know that this peace can only come from my son.”**

Scripture: Isaiah 9:6 — “Prince of Peace.”

Explanation: Jesus alone is the source of divine and lasting peace.

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**“I ask that you also share this peace with people whom I send.”**

Scripture: Matthew 28:19 — “Go therefore and make disciples.”

Explanation: Christians are called to evangelize and share Christ’s peace with others.

**“This is not for you alone, but you must spread it.”**

Scripture: Matthew 5:14–16 — “You are the light of the world.”

Explanation: Faith must be lived publicly so others may encounter God.

**“You must proclaim the goodness of my beloved son.”**

Scripture: 1 Peter 2:9 — “Proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you.”

Explanation: Evangelization flows from gratitude for God’s mercy.

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**“So many are searching... seeking worldly things to give them peace and joy.”**

Scripture: Ecclesiastes 1:14 — “All is vanity.”

Explanation: Earthly pursuits cannot satisfy the deepest desires of the human heart.

**“You have found the answer. Now you must live it and share it.”**

Scripture: James 1:22 — “Be doers of the word, and not hearers only.”

Explanation: Authentic faith requires living and witnessing the Gospel.

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**“Do not let the pressures and material goods of this world hold you fast.”**

Scripture: 1 John 2:15–17 — “Do not love the world or the things in the world.”

Explanation: Attachment to worldly goods can hinder spiritual freedom.

**“You must surrender all.”**

Scripture: Luke 9:23 — “Take up his cross daily and follow me.”

Explanation: Discipleship involves surrendering one’s life to Christ.

**“The joys this world gives will fade away.”**

Scripture: Matthew 24:35 — “Heaven and earth will pass away.”

Explanation: Temporal pleasures are fleeting compared to eternal joy.

**“The joys my son will give... will never fade.”**

Scripture: John 16:22 — “Your joy no one will take from you.”

Explanation: Joy rooted in Christ is everlasting.

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**“You only have to ask my son for his graces to turn from sin and turn to Him.”**

Scripture: 1 John 1:9 — “If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive.”

Explanation: God always grants grace for repentance to those who sincerely ask.

**“Ask... and then strive to follow Him.”**

Scripture: Matthew 7:7 — “Ask, and it will be given to you.”

Explanation: Prayer must be accompanied by the sincere effort to live according to Christ’s teachings.
