The last month has felt somewhat like living in the desert. Going into this situation, I feel that many of us wandered around not really knowing what to do or how to cope with all the changes that were suddenly happening.



One night as I struggled to fall asleep, the Holy Spirit brought to my mind the parable of the Good

Samaritan. If you have forgotten where to find it,

look in Luke 10:25-37. I know that when we look at this parable we think of Jesus as the Good Samaritan. We feel warm and fuzzy at the thought that he picks us up, tends our wounds and pays our expenses; rightfully so, but I believe there is more to this parable that reveals our behaviors. The whole reason why Jesus shared this parable is because an expert of the law chose to test Jesus with the question, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Because Jesus knows that this man thinks he is an "expert, Jesus says, "What is written in the law? How do <u>you</u> read it?" (emphasis added by me) To which he answered, "Love the Lord your God with all you heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and love your neighbor as yourself." There is more to this conversation, but I am going to share the revelation that I believe the Holy Spirit gave me.

In the parable, a man goes into the desert, from Jerusalem to Jericho. We know that this was a dangerous road. This man went alone, with no tools, no weapons, he was unprepared. Much like this man, many of us at the beginning of this pandemic wandered into the "desert" with no preparation. What happened to this man? He was robbed! Have you felt robbed? When he was robbed, he was stripped of his clothes, beaten and left for dead. Just like us, in our journey we have been stripped of our security, we have been beaten down by our emotions and most of us have been left without the Sacraments that sustained our spiritual life.

This man hoped that, as he saw a priest pass by, that he would stop to help, but he did not stop. As he saw the Levite pass by, again he was left unaided. What have you looked to aid you? The traditional form of the church that we have become so familiar with has been taken from us. Even our friends and family cannot help us in this situation. Once again, we have been left unaided just as this man. This pandemic has forced us to go beyond what we think we know. It has forced us to go beyond our normal comforts and forms of worship. It has caused me to look deep into my heart and has tested my faith in ways that I did not know it could be tested. This pandemic has caused us to recognize who God is to us, who Jesus is to us, who the Holy Spirit is to us. Have you taken time to explore a new relationship with Him? Or have you still held on to your old comfort? What did you turn to? Television? Alcohol? Junk food? Who did you seek? Facebook? The Good Samaritan is on His way to rescue you, to heal your wounds and to pay your debt. Will you allow Him to show you something new? We have a new normal. How will we allow this to transform us? I pray that each of us will answer His call to a new level of holiness. As we continue on this journey, let us join Jesus in His passion by offering up all of our suffering in union with His for all who are suffering through similar struggles. Let us offer up our desire to go shopping for those who have been confined to their homes or a hospital long before this pandemic. I believe that as we offer up our suffering, the Holy Spirit will give us a new perspective, we will lose our sense of entitlement and we will gain a grateful heart for all of the things that we have taken for granted, especially the precious sacraments and time with our loved ones.



It is a new dawn that is coming, and the light of this new dawn will shine through you.


