"Come, I will show you" (17:1)	"Come, I will show you" (21:9)
"the great harlot" (Rev. 17:1)	"the Bride, the wife of the Lamb" (21:9)
"And he carried me away in the Spirit" (17:3)	"And in the Spirit he carried me away" (21:10)
"I saw a . . . woman arrayed in purple and scarlet, bedecked with gold and jewels and pearls" (17:4)	"having the glory of God, its radiance like a most rare jewel, like jasper, clear as crystal" (21:11)
"on her forehead was written a name of mystery: 'Babylon the great, mother of harlots'" (17:5)	"on the gates the names of the twelve tribes of the sons of Israel were inscribed" (21:12)
"It has become a dwelling place of demons" (18:2)	"Behold, the dwelling of God is with men" (21:3)
"mother of harlots and of earth's abominations" (17:5) or "falsehood" (21:27)	"nothing unclean shall enter it, not anyone who practices abomination" (21:27)
"[those] whose names are not written in the book of life from the foundation of the world, will marvel to behold the beast" (17:8)	"only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life [shall enter]" (21:27) ³
