We want to sincerely thank you for the generosity and support you have shown us in the past. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic this year, we have had to cut back on staff and other essentials that are needed in our day to day operations, yet we stayed open as an essential business. Events and fundraisers were postponed or cancelled. The lost income was vital in sustaining our daily operating expenses for the shelter, along with providing care needed for the homeless animals.

Stray Haven has been serving Tioga, Bradford, and Chemung Counties for over 53 years and never has there been a time that we have needed your help more than now. **As the only no-kill, 501c-3 animal shelter in Tioga County, we rely solely on the donations of our community to continue our lifesaving work.** Even during the pandemic, homeless pets still needed care, and the demand for our low-cost spay/neuter program, free rabies clinics, and Pet Pantry were incredibly high. We altered more than 1,000 dogs and cats in 2020, administered 540 rabies vaccines and 187 distemper vaccines to pets at our free clinics, and held 2 food drives for the hardest hit families because of the lockdown.

Although fewer dogs were coming into our facility this year, we partnered with some high-kill shelters in rural North Carolina to transport dogs/puppies to our facility for adoption. That relationship has not only saved more animals but has helped members of our community find and adopt their forever canine companions. And even though "kitten season" hit full force in 2020, thanks to 50 different foster homes we were able to save many underage kitties. In fact, **459 dogs and cats have found homes this year at Stray Haven, and the year isn't even over yet!**

With your much-needed help and support, we can give unwanted, stray and injured animals the care they deserve, the shelter they need, and hope they will find the loving home they deserve. 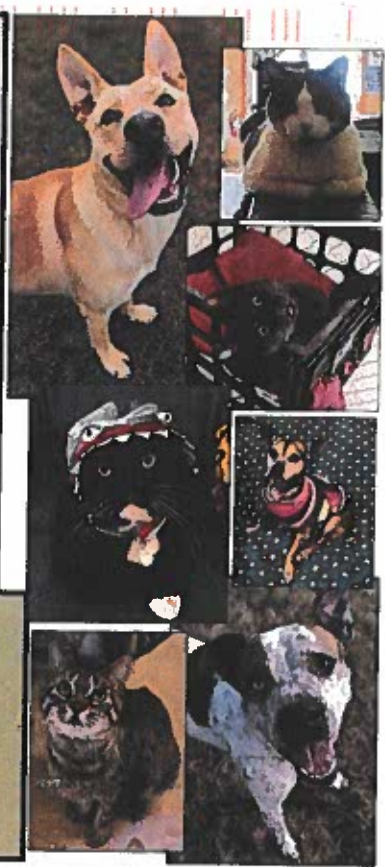
