
#### Denny

I remember him being very welcoming to me as I came as a second year fellow, an outsider from a mediocre Boston program, and after 2 years as an internist in Sasebo. I was certainly rusty and had no bronch experience. He made sure I was in the bronch rotation the same as the first year fellows (Bob Sarlin, Jim Bodicka). My memories of Dick are his smoking in his office and quickly hiding the ashtray when someone came in. Also the way he consumed-read, ripped and filed- the Blue Journal and CHEST the day they arrived. He didn't get to the wards much but had the respect of everyone in the department. The daily 8 AM conferences in his office to review the consults from the day before were great learning experiences.
